THURSDAY, 3 MAY 2018

- 1 The House met at Ten o'clock a.m.
- 2 PRAYERS. – The Speaker read Prayers.
- 3 QUESTIONS SEEKING INFORMATION. – In accordance with Standing Order No. 43, Questions without notice were asked.
- 4 PAPERS. – The Premier laid upon the Table of the House the following Papers:-
