- 1 The House met at Ten o'clock a.m.
- 2 PRAYERS. – The Speaker read Prayers.

- 7 BILL NO. 14. – The Minister for Infrastructure presented -

“A Bill for an Act to amend the Metro Tasmania Act 1997 to enable Metro Tasmania to provide any form of public transport and to repeal Part 3A of that Act, to amend that Act, and certain other Acts under which state-owned companies are formed, to allow the members of Metro Tasmania and of those companies to provide statements of their expectations and to require Metro Tasmania and those companies to comply with Treasurer's Instructions issued under the Government Business Enterprises Act 1995, to consequentially amend the Metro Tasmania Fares Order 2016 and for related purposes”

And Mr *Rockliff* having presented the said Bill, the same was read the First time and made an Order of the Day for tomorrow.

We desire to record our continued loyalty to the Throne and Person of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second, and at the same time to assure Your Excellency that the measures which will be laid before us during the Session will receive our careful consideration.
