

**11. CORNELIAN BAY MANAGEMENT PLAN – RESULTS OF  
COMMUNITY CONSULTATION PROCESS – FILE REF: 33-11-4**  
Ref. Open P&CSC 5, 7/12/2006 **COUNCIL MINUTE 18/12/06**

That: 1. The Draft Cornelian Bay Management Plan be endorsed as a basis for the management of the area, subject to the qualifications set out below.

2. The current off-leash dog exercise area be retained in its current form and management initiatives be introduced to ensure the ongoing compatibility of off-leash dog walking and the areas' natural and cultural values is achieved. Such management initiatives include:

(i) Seeking specialist advice on the management of the nationally listed – *Austrodanthonia popinensis* (blue or roadside wallaby grass);

(ii) A fauna survey of the area;

(iii) Counts and a survey of pedestrians and dog walkers using the track along the escarpment and cyclists using the access road; and

(iv) Blocking access to sensitive bushland areas via brush matting or fencing.

3. The provisions in Section 6.9 of the Management Plan:

(i) Re-affirm that existing exotic trees will not be removed until the end of their useful lives, and

(ii) The species selected for the replacement of those exotic trees will be based on the cultural and natural values of the planting location.

4. Formal discussions be entered into with the Boatshed Owners Association and Crown Land Services on the provision of:

(i) Upgraded water supply and connections to the boatsheds;

(ii) The provision of mains sewerage; and

(iii) The financial contribution of the boatshed owners for water supply and connection and the provision of mains sewerage, as listed above.

5. The removal of the boat ramp be confirmed but options be investigated for access to the water by those not requiring boat trailer access, i.e. kayak or canoe users as part of the detailed project work on a Shoreline Erosion Mitigation Plan, Traffic and Landscape Plan and a Foreshore Park Landscape Plan.

6. The other modifications suggested to the Management Plan as set out in Attachment B to the report attached to item 5 of the Open Parks and Customer Services Committee agenda of 7 December 2006, be endorsed.

7. Submissions on matters such as seats, litter bins, lighting etc be considered in the preparation of detailed landscape plans.
8. A further report be submitted on updating the original budget for the implementation of the Management Plan as set out in Attachment F of the report attached to item 5 of the Open Park and Customer Services Committee agenda of 7 December 2006, having regard to recommendations 13.2- 13.8.
9. Immediate priorities for implementation of the works identified in the Management Plan be considered as part of the annual consideration of the 10 year New Asset Projects Program.
10. The proponent of the proposal for land reclamation and development be informed that this is considered to be inconsistent with the content of the Management Plan.
11. The Lord Mayor issue an appropriate media release.
