

Sir,

I HAVE the honour to submit the Fifth Annual Report of the Launceston Benevolent Asylum for the year ending 31st December, 1899.

Admissions and Discharges.

The daily average of Inmates for the year was, males, 130; females, 43; total, 173; of whom 170 were chargeable to the Colonial Government, and 3 to the Imperial Government.

During the year there were 56 deaths, of whom 44 were males and 12 females.

Expenditure.

The total expenditure was £2041 19s. 5d., of which £2000 was contributed by the Government; the balance was received from fees and other sources.

The annual cost per head to the Government was £10 18s. $10\frac{3}{8}d$, the gross cost amounting to £11 6s. $0\frac{3}{4}d$, the daily cost was about $7\frac{5}{8}d$ per head.

The buildings have been made much more comfortable and improved in appearance, especially the interior.

The conduct and health of the Inmates have been satisfactory through the year.
