



## CAMPBELL TOWN HOSPITAL:

REPORT FOR 1890.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



REPORT of the Board of Management of the Campbell Town Hospital for the Year ending 31st December, 1890.

The usefulness of this Institution has been practically shown in the late outbreak of diphtheria, arising from infection from a patient brought from Avoca, when the House Surgeon used it as a place of isolation for infected patients, and there can be no doubt that this very materially assisted to stop the further spread of this dread disease.

The total number of patients treated was 80, as against 48 last year.

Finance.—The expenses in connection with the completion and furnishing of the new hospital have been necessarily very great, and the balance sheet appended shows a debit balance of £102 14s. 10d. on 31st December, 1890.

From the late Arthur Leake, Esq., the Hospital has received a legacy of £1000, and Miss L. Leake has generously promised the sum of £20 per annum as a contribution towards the maintenance of the extra nurse, whom it has been found necessary to appoint owing to the great increase of work. The other subscriptions have, I regret to say, fallen off, from £113 last year, to £91 18s. 10d.

Owing to the exertions of our Member, the Government placed upon the Estimates for last and current year the sums of £100, in addition to the Annual Grant of £1 for £1 subscribed, which Parliament was pleased to grant.

The cost of erection of the new hospital, with furniture, and laying out and planting of grounds being now all defrayed, the prospects of the future look bright and hopeful.

Contributions of fruit, flowers, vegetables, eggs, books, and clothing have been received from Mesdames Riordan, Pitt, Leake, Buist, Stormont, and Thullow; the Misses Finlay, Turnbull, Bell, Pitt, Littlechild, Power, Valentine, and Leake; Dr. Byrne, Col. Lethbridge, and C. F. Pitt.

Dr. Byrne resigned on the 31st December last, and, subject to the approval of the Board, I appointed Dr. Tofft Medical Officer. I would recommend that Dr. Byrne be appointed Honorary Medical Officer, and cannot conclude this Report without stating that his services to the Hospital have been invaluable. Dr. Tofft appears to take an equal interest in the Institution, and I think that the public should be most grateful to both gentlemen for devoting so much time for so small a remuneration.

The conduct of the Master and Matron has been very satisfactory, and I have much pleasure in recommending them for the annual gratuity.
