REPORT OF THE BOARD OF IMMIGRATION.

Immigration Office, Hobart Town, 25th January, 1870.

THE Board of Immigration have the honor to furnish their usual Annual Report on Immigration for the year ending 31st December, 1869.

The number of Immigrants introduced during the year under the Bounty System was 28.

Of these, 10 were male adults, 9 female adults, 5 male children, and 4 female children.

Five Immigrants were from England, twenty-two from Ireland, and one from Scotland. Of these, one was a farmer, eight were labourers, six domestic servants, and one a tradesman.

During the year, four family, eleven male, and fourteen female Bounty Tickets have been issued. Of these, one single female ticket has been returned unused and cancelled.

The total passage money for the twenty-eight souls introduced amounted to £368; from which the sum of £145 has to be deducted as the price of the tickets. The cost to the Board, therefore, on account of these Immigrants was £223.

Under the 7th Section of the 31st Victoria, No. 26, the Board have issued nine Certificates, entitling the holders to select, on account of themselves and their families, 560 acres of the waste lands of the Crown.

These Certificates were claimed on account of nine males, six females, and seventeen children.

Mr. Frederick Buck, the Agent of the Board in Germany, has been actively employed in disseminating information respecting Tasmania by the free distribution of a pamphlet prepared by him and printed in English and German. He has personally visited the localities from whence he anticipated deriving the greatest number of Emigrants, and has established sub-agencies in a great many towns and villages.

He expects the larger number of Emigrants will take their passages under the Bounty System, for as a rule the emigrating classes in Germany, though by no means paupers, are not sufficiently well off to pay the whole cost of their passage money and outfit. He has, however, commenced the issue of Land Order Warrants under the 31st Vict. No. 26, and probably the extended operations of this scheme will in great measure depend upon the reports sent home by the first arrivals.

The available balance at the disposal of the Board on the 31st December last amounted to £13,966.

Appended are five tabulated Returns prepared by the Immigration Agent referring to the operation of the Board under the Bounty System, and one relating to the transactions under the Act of Parliament, 31st Vict. No. 26.
