



MUNICIPAL POLICE.

REPORT FOR 1892.

Commissioner's Office, Hobart, 21st July, 1893.

Sir,

I have the honor to submit my Annual Report upon the Police appointed for the several Municipalities within the Colony for the year 1892, in accordance with Section 7 of "The Police Regulation-Act, 1865."

I visited thirteen of the Municipalities during the year, in each of which I had some special official business to transact. In the others (eight) my presence was not specially required, and I found it unnecessary to devote time to visiting them.

The Municipal Councils each maintained sufficient Police, with necessary stations and watchhouse premises, to meet the requirements of the Act.

I append the particulars of the Police Establishment of each Municipality in detail, and I also attach the usual Returns of offences furnished by the several Municipal Officers.
