

Sir,

WE have the honor to forward to you the Annual Report of St. Joseph's Orphanage and Industrial School.

During the year everything has gone on as usual in the Institution.

The legacy left by the late Mr. Guillois has been received,—£80 in cash and £30 worth of furniture. The late Rev. Patrick Hewitt, of Sydney, left £50 to procure warm winter clothing, by which each child got a comfortable Ulster and other necessary articles.

The high price of provisions still continues, which causes the receipts to be less than the expenses; but we hope during 1887 to clear the debt, as many kind friends take an interest in the Institution.

The number of grown girls apprenticed has lessened the receipts of the Laundry, whilst the large number of young children at present in the Orphanage prevents any reduction in the expenditure in that department.

The children had their usual trip to Brown's River, and feasts given to them by His Lordship the Bishop and the Very Rev. Dean Woods.
