

His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased, in accordance with Section 12 of "The Fisheries Act, 1889," to approve of the following Regulations relating to the use of nets:—

By His Excellency's Command,

WM. MOORE, Chief Secretary.

The use of nets of every description, except crayfish nets, is hereby prohibited during the months of May, June, July, and August, in each and every year, in the tidal waters along the shore and extending seaward for half a mile, between the south-east extremity of Cape Raoul and the south-east extremity of Inner West Head (commonly called Stand Up Point), Tasman Peninsula, in Tasmania; and any person committing any breach of this Regulation shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

NETTING IN LITTLE SWANPORT.

The use of nets of every description is hereby prohibited in the tidal waters of Little Swanport, in the Rural Municipalities of Glamorgan and Spring Bay, in Tasmania, above a straight line drawn from the North-east angle of the Town of Pontypool to the South end of Ram Island, and thence to the opposite shore; and any person committing any breach of this Regulation shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.
