



MUNICIPAL POLICE:

REPORT FOR 1885.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



Police Department, Inspector's Office, Hobart, 29th June, 1886.

SIR,

I have the honor to submit the Annual Report upon the state of the Municipal Police for the year 1885, for the information of His Excellency the Governor.

I entered upon the duties of Inspector of Police for the Colony on the 18th January last. I am not therefore in a position to furnish any statement of the condition during the year of the several bodies of Police under the control of the Municipal Councils of the City of Hobart, the Town of Launceston, and the Rural Municipalities based upon my own personal knowledge or observation.

The sudden death at the close of the year 1885 of my predecessor the late Mr. Swan, and the promotion of the Chief Clerk Mr. Norman to a higher office in another department, followed almost immediately by his death, leaving the junior clerk Mr. Rule, the only officer at head quarters, combined with my own inability above referred to, render it impossible that this Report can be anything beyond a formal statement of the number and position of the officers and men, with the usual tabulated returns of offences, and the result of proceedings against offenders.
