
PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

JUDGES' DUTIES:

RETURN FOR FIRST EIGHT MONTHS OF 1886.

Return to Order, Legislative Council, October 6, 1886. (Mr. Fysh.)

Laid upon the Table by Dr. Agnew, and ordered by the Legislative Council to be printed, October 14, 1886.



A RETURN, in accordance with an Order of the Legislative Council, of Judges' Duties for the first Eight Months of 1886.

- 1. Cases tried at the Supreme Court in Hobart, naming time of Judge occupied by same:—37 cases, occupying 15 days.
 - 2. The like for Launceston: -22 cases, occupying 10 days.
- 3. Cases tried at the Supreme Court in Hobart, in its Small Debts Act Jurisdiction, naming time of Judge occupied by same:—24 cases, occupying 21 days.
 - 4. The like for Launceston:—7 cases, occupying 5 days.
- 5. Number of times Judge applied to in Chambers in connection with above. Average time of Judge occupied at same:—Nil as to Small Debts Jurisdiction; other cases included in reply No. 12.
 - 6. Number of cases tried in Banco: -24.
 - 7. Averagé time occupied by same: -About 1 day in each case.
- 8. Number of applications in Chambers as to No. 6—Average time occupied by same :—Nil.
 - 9. Number of Bankruptcies in Hobart:-35.
- 10. Number of Public Examinations under 9—Average time occupied by same:—1, occupying 2 hours.
- 11. Number of applications in Chambers as to Nos. 9 and 10, and average time occupied by same:—8, average 1 hour each.
- 12. Any other duties performed by Judges, and average time occupied in each duty:—

Probates granted	124
Administrations granted	62
Curator's orders granted	53
Solicitors admitted in Chambers	8
Applications in Chambers	76

Average time, 11 hours each day.

13. Average time of Judge occupied in Judicial duties during the four last months of 1885:—35 full days; and 38 days, average 1½ hours each.
