



## THE UNIVERSITY OF TASMANIA.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1895.

*To His Excellency the Right Honorable JENICO WILLIAM JOSEPH, VISCOUNT GORMANSTON, K.C.M.G., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.*

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

The Council of the University of Tasmania, in conformity with the provisions of "The Tasmanian University Act," has the honour to report, for the information of Your Excellency in Council, the proceedings of the University for the year 1895.

### I.—PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS.

#### Junior Public Examination.

The fifth Examination under the Regulations for the Junior Public Examination was held at Hobart and Launceston in the month of December, from the 2nd to the 7th, both dates inclusive, under the following Examiners:—Messrs. W. H. Williams, M.A., A. W. Garrett, B.A., A. W. B. Perceval, B.A., A. M'Aulay, M.A., Major Wyly, and Mr. W. H. Jones.

Fifty-one candidates presented themselves, of whom twenty-two were girls. Forty-two passed; fifteen being placed in the First Class, and twenty-seven in the Second.

#### Junior Exhibitions.

On the result of the foregoing Examination, the Council awarded to the five following candidates Junior Exhibitions of the value of £20 per annum each, tenable for three years from the 1st January, 1896, at the Institutions mentioned after their names:—

The last-named candidate having declined the Exhibition, it was awarded to Nellie Maria Smith, Queen's College.

#### Senior Public Examination.

The fifth Examination under the Regulations for the Senior Public Examination began at Hobart and Launceston on the 28th November, and ended on the 6th December.

Twenty-one candidates presented themselves, of whom nineteen satisfied the Examiners. Of these eight were placed in the First Class, five in the Second, and six in the Third.

The Sir Richard Dry prize for Modern Languages, including English, was for a second time awarded to Irene Evershed.

#### University Scholarships.

On the Report of the Board of Examiners for the Senior Public Examination, two University Scholarships, each of the value of £50 per annum, tenable for three years from the 1st January, 1896, were awarded as follows:—

One to John Redford Oberlin Harris for the best Examination in the subjects of Groups I. and II.—Languages, English History, and Geography; and one to John Cameron for the best Examination in the subjects of Groups III. and IV.—Mathematics and Science.

#### Class Lists.

Class Lists of the Senior and Junior Public Examinations are appended to this Report.

The total number of candidates examined was 72.

### II.—UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS.

#### Third or Final Honour Examination.

On the 13th and following days of March a Third or Final Honour Examination in Group B. was held, at which one candidate, L. S. Gorrige, presented himself, and satisfied the Examiners, who were—in Physics, Professor Threlfall, of

Sydney University; in Practical Physics, Mr. F. M. Young, B.A.; and in Mathematics, Dr. J. H. Macfarland, M.A., of Ormond College, Melbourne.

#### Supplementary Examination.

At the Examination, Supplementary to the Ordinary Examination of 1894, held in the Second week of December, 1895, two candidates presented themselves, and satisfied the Examiners in the subjects of English and Logic respectively, both thereby completing their First Examination.

#### Ordinary Examinations.

On the 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th, and 13th December there were held the Ordinary Examinations for the Degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science, and for the Degree of Bachelor of Laws. The Examiners were the Lecturers of the University, with the following coadjutors for the B.A. and B.Sc. subjects:—Professors H. Laurie, LL.D. (Melbourne); M. W. MacCallum, M.A. (Sydney); and Mr. E. J. Trechmann, M.A. (Sydney); and for the Law subjects, Professor W. H. Moore (Melbourne); the Hon. N. E. Lewis, M.A., B.C.L.; Mr. F. Lodge, B.A.

For the Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science Examinations there were in all 11 candidates—6 from Hobart, 5 from Launceston and other districts; of these 9 passed their several Examinations.

For the Bachelor of Laws Examinations six candidates entered from Hobart and three from Launceston, and satisfied the Examiners.

Twenty-two candidates in all presented themselves for the Degree Examinations. The names of the candidates who passed, and the classes in which Honour candidates were placed, are set forth in the class lists annexed to the Report.

### IV.—DEGREES CONFERRED.

On Commemoration Day, 19th December, the Annual Meeting of the University was held in the Town Hall, when addresses were delivered by Your Excellency as Visitor, and by the Chancellor, Sir Lambert Dobson. ### V.—LECTURES DELIVERED AT THE UNIVERSITY.

The number of Lectures delivered at the University throughout the Academic year has been the same as in

previous years, averaging 40 in each week. The number of Students attending under the University Lecturers in the third term was thirteen, and under the Instructor in Chemistry, two.

### VI.—TEACHING AT LAUNCESTON.

The University Lecturers have continued to pay weekly visits to Launceston to deliver lectures and give students assistance and direction in their several courses of study. Additional teaching was given during the year by the appointment of Mr. H. C. Kingsmill, M.A., and Mr. A. W. B. Perceval, B.A.; the former to give instruction in Mathematics weekly, under the Lecturer in that subject, and the latter in Modern Languages, also weekly. The result has been an increase in the number of students at Launceston to sixteen.

### VII.—EXTENSION LECTURES.

Extension Lectures, which were fairly well attended, were given by Lecturers and other Members of the University in the following subjects:—

At Hobart, on "The Rise and Growth of the English Drama," by Mr. W. H. Williams, M.A.; and on "The Principles of Astronomy," by Mr. F. M. Young, B.A.

At Launceston, on "Mining Geology," by Mr. A. Montgomery, M.A.; and on "Contingent Remainders," by Dr. W. J. Brown.

### VIII.—THE COUNCIL.

The Rev. George Clarke, who has held the office of Vice-Chancellor since the inauguration of the University was, on the 21st January, unanimously re-elected for the year.

#### Deaths of Mr. Tarleton and Dr. Giblin.

The Council regrets to have to record the deaths of two Members of the Council; viz.—Mr. Wm. Tarleton, who was first elected in September, 1890, and who died on the 7th July, 1895; and Dr. Edward O. Giblin, who was also first elected in September, 1890, and who died on the 27th December, 1895.

Both these gentlemen had been Members of the Council from the foundation of the University, and had been conspicuous for their keen interest in its work. Their deaths occasion a loss which will not be easily repaired.

Mr. Tarleton's experience and sound judgment had been of the greatest value, not only in the ordinary work of the Council, but in the responsible position of Chairman of the Finance Committee.

Dr. Giblin, as a Member of the Board of Degrees, and later as a Member of the Board of Studies, had rendered most valuable service in the difficult task of organising the studies and teaching of the University.

#### Council Elections.

The Hon. Adye Douglas was elected by the Legislative Council, on the 2nd August, in the place of Mr. H. C. Kingsmill, M.A., resigned.

The Ven. Archdeacon Whittington, LL.B., was, on the 16th September, elected by the Senate, in succession to the late Mr. W. Tarleton.

The seven Members who, agreeably to the Act, would have vacated their seats on the last day of the year, were re-elected on the following dates:—

On the 4th October, The Rev. J. Scott, D.D., Mr. Justice Dodds, The Rev. T. Kelsh, The Hon. A. I. Clark, by the Houses of Parliament.

On the 21st October, Mr. T. Stephens, M.A., Mr. J. B. Walker, Mr. G. W. Waterhouse, B.A., by the Senate.

#### Meetings of Council.

#### X. THE FACULTIES.

At the first Annual Meeting of the year, the Council elected by ballot for each Faculty Four Members of Council to serve with the *ex officio* Members of the Faculty, and the Faculties as thus constituted for the year held the following number of meetings respectively:—Faculty of Letters, 3; Faculty of Science, 3; Faculty of Law, 2.

#### XI. COMMITTEES.

#### XII. THE SENATE.

The number of meetings held by the Senate was two, and the measures approved appear below under the heading "Statutes and Regulations."

The Rev. R. D. Poulett-Harris, M.A., was, for the sixth time, elected Warden.

#### XIII. STATUTES AND REGULATIONS.

The under-mentioned new Regulations and Amendments of Statutes and Regulations having been made by the Council and approved by the Senate, were allowed and countersigned by Your Excellency on the dates below specified:—

#### XIV. PARLIAMENTARY APPROPRIATION.

The University received the sum of £2800 only for the year 1895, of which £450 was absorbed by the Tasmanian Scholarships then current. For the year 1896 it received the sum of £2500, in lieu of the £4000 provided by the University Act, but the Council has been able to arrange for the continuance of teaching at Hobart and Launceston during the coming year, having had a balance in hand from 1895. As there will be no balance to carry forward from 1896, a Parliamentary appropriation of not less than £3000 will be necessary for 1897.

#### XV.—ACCOUNTS.

The audited Account of Income and Expenditure, required by the provisions of "The Tasmanian University Act," is hereto appended.

## GIBLIN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND.
