

PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

CONTAGIOUS DISEASES HOSPITAL, CASCADES: REPORT FOR 1890.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



Contagious Diseases Hospital, Cascades, 31st March, 1891.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to submit the Annual Report of this Institution for the year 1890.

The number of admissions for the whole period was 18.

All the patients were natives of the Colony. 14 were Protestants and 4 were Roman Catholics; and their average ages (with the exception of two, one aged 29, the other 39) ranged from 18 to 25 years.

The character of the diseases is noted in Return A.

No patients were in the Hospital at the commencement of the year, nor were any remaining after December 23rd.
