

SIR, I HAVE the honour to submit the Third Annual Report of the Launceston Benevolent Asylums for the year ending 31st December, 1897.

The daily average was, males 145, females 52; total 197, of whom 195 were charged to the Colonial Government and two to the Imperial Government.

During the year there were 45 deaths, of whom 30 were males and 15 females.

The average age of inmates was 73.40 for males, 71.25 females.
