

## OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

### REPORT FOR 1894.

Charitable Grants Department, New Town, 31st May, 1895.

SIR

I have the honor to submit the following Report for the year 1894 on the subject of Outdoor Relief, &c. to Destitute Persons throughout the Colony, and the expenditure for transport and funeral expenses.

The number of cases in which relief was given, and the number of persons amongst whom it was distributed, were as follows:—Total number of cases, 441; number of individuals, 1054—584 adults and 470 children, belonging to 138 families.

Further details will be found in the return forwarded herewith.

In Launceston the work connected with the Department was carried on under the supervision of the Superintendent of the Invalid Depòt, and in the Municipal and Police Districts the Wardens, Police Magistrates, and Superintendents of Police reported upon the circumstances of applicants, and disbursed such relief as was authorised.

Repayments, however, amounting to £72 16s. 0d. were received, which reduced the actual expenditure to £4053 13s. 10d., £146 6s. 2d. under the total sum voted, viz., £4200.

#### Transport and Funeral Expenses.

For this service the sum of £500 was provided, but there has been charged against the vote the sum of £518 12s. 4d. The actual expenditure, however, was only £309 13s. 8d., as £38 5s. 1d. was received as repayments, and £170 13s. 7d. represents payments made to the Railway Department for the conveyance of paupers, in reality a mere transfer of funds from one department to another. Included in this expenditure is the cost of the conveyance to their homes of 73 prisoners on discharge from sentence.

The following are the particulars of the number of orders issued during the year for out-door treatment as paupers at the Hospital, Hobart:—New cases, 695; renewals, 786; single visits, 160; refused, 114. Dr. Barnard also received 449 orders to visit cases in the city, and Dr. Smart, 101. Total applications, 2305.

The annual claim upon the Imperial Government for repayment of the cost of Imperial paupers who were a charge to the Colony during the year amounted to £1383 14s. 3d.

During the year there were 20 admissions to the Lying-in Home, and the inmates were under the care of the resident midwife, Mrs. Boam, who acted as occasion required under the orders of the medical officer, Dr. Crouch. The internal arrangements of the Home were under the supervision of the Ladies' Committee.

The Administrator of Charitable Grants, John O'Boyle, Esq., retired on the 31st December in consequence of alterations in the system of administering the Department.
