

RETURN OF, PERFORMED AT THE GENERAL HOSPITALS, HOBART TOWN AND LAUNCESTON.

Return to an Order of the Council dated September 12, 1867. (Mr. Whyte.)

Laid upon the Table by Sir R. Dry, and ordered by the Council to be printed, October 1, 1867.



General Hospital, 19th September, 1867.

In forwarding the accompanying Return, in accordance with instructions received in your Memorandum of 16th instant, I beg to remark that soon after gratuitous Vaccination was commenced at the General Hospital, Hobart Town, and before sufficient time had elapsed to make it generally known, Measles became very prevalent in the City. This will fully account for the very small number of persons who have been vaccinated during the last Six months.
