

REPORT.

REVENUE.

Revenue Proper.—The Revenue of the year 1885 received, and estimated as outstanding, amounts to £569,466 18s. 8d.—viz., £562,965 15s. 8d. received, and £6501 3s. estimated,—and shows an increase of £21,601 0s. 7d. upon the Revenue of the year 1884. The several increases and decreases under the respective heads are explained in the following table:-

It is satisfactory to notice that a substantial increase has taken place under every head of Ordinary Revenue, and that decreases occur only in what may be called extraordinary receipts.

Upon inspection of the accounts of Mr. Geo. Smith, the Registrar of the Court of Requests at Launceston, a deficiency of £1492 4s. 9d. was discovered and reported. The Government allowed the officer to pay over the amount to the Revenue, and his services were dispensed with.

Fees under Police Act.—Further correspondence has taken place since my last Report respecting this matter, but the Government has failed, as yet, to make any satisfactory arrangement. It is very desirable that those Municipalities that have omitted to pay over the amounts due to the Revenue should be compelled to do so, or that the law should be altered so as to admit of these fees being properly payable to Municipal Funds.

EXPENDITURE.

Ordinary.—The Ordinary Expenditure of the year 1885 chargeable to the Consolidated Revenue ascertained to 31st March, 1886, amounts to £565,756 11s. 8d.; viz:—

and it is estimated that the outstanding expenditure will amount to £20,000, which will make the Ordinary Expenditure of the year £585,756 11s. 8d., as compared with £575,569 16s. 8d. for the year 1884. £50,000 of Treasury Bills have also been redeemed this year, being balance of those raised in 1880 to meet the deficiency in the Revenue to the end of 1879, the amount having been paid out of the surplus Revenue of the years succeeding 1879.

Expenditure not voted by Parliament.—A Return (A.) is appended of Expenditure on account of the year 1885 not previously sanctioned by Parliament but authorised by the Governor in Council under

Section 19 of the Regulations under the "Audit Act, No. 3." The special items referred to in my last report have been provided for, with the exception of £1571 0s. 3d. expended on account of the Invalid Depôt at Launceston. It is hoped that proper provision for this amount will be made during the next Session of Parliament.

Expenditure for the Construction of the Mersey and Deloraine Railway.—Act No. 46 Vict. No. 22 authorised the construction of the Mersey and Deloraine Railway upon plans and estimates then approved by the Government, and Act 46 Vict. No. 45 provided £120,000 for that purpose; but it appears that subsequently further expenditure, amounting to £65,000, became necessary consequent upon alterations of the original plans and other causes, and the latter amount has been provided under Loan Act 49 Vict. No. 54, and has been specified in this Act in the following manner:—

and undoubtedly in the alteration referred to the construction of entirely new works was necessary: for this reason a Construction Vote was necessary, as well as on the ground of the general principle that in all cases of excess expenditure for Public Works a Construction Act should be passed by Parliament previously to the introduction of the Bill for appropriation; but it does not appear that the construction of the new work has in any way been voted. Objection was taken by me in 1885, in a query referred to the Honorable the Minister of Lands and Works, with regard to the item £40,000. The Minister disagreed with me as to the necessity for a distinct vote for additional construction, but, after considerable correspondence on the subject had taken place, it was understood that the amount would be properly provided during the Session of 1885; but no evidence that any vote for construction had been passed by Parliament can be traced in the Parliamentary Journals. Attention to this matter is therefore urgently requested.

Vote for Industrial School, Launceston.—Act 48 Vict. No. 47 provides for the payment of £500 to the Industrial School, at Launceston, "on condition of the same amount being raised by subscription." This amount has, in my opinion, been paid contrary to the special condition upon which the money was voted. In Query No. 209, 5th September, 1885, objection was taken by me to this payment on the ground—

- 1. That the subscriptions credited in the accounts submitted by the Chairman of the Governors of the School in support of the claim for the amount voted by Parliament were received previously to the passing of the Act.
- 2. That the amount shown in the Account as received from subscriptions and donations amounted to £164 only.
- 3. That a large amount of the sum claimed to have been subscribed had been raised and expended for other objects than that upon which the money was voted by Parliament.
- 4. That the Vote did not appear to have been intended to have a retrospective effect as regards subscriptions; and that even allowing that it did, the amount subscribed only amounted to £214.

The Minister of Lands, in reply, states that this matter had been carefully considered by the Cabinet, and it was agreed that the terms upon which the Vote was passed by Parliament had been substantially complied with; and the Chairman, in his reply to the query, evidently bases his claim upon the fact of a sum exceeding £500 being at credit of the Building Fund. Upon carefully examining the accounts furnished by the Chairman of the Governors of the School, I think that the objections taken by me have not been met by the explanations given, and, therefore, refer the case for further consideration.

Expenditure for Special Public Works.—In a Memorandum of the Honorable the Treasurer of 4th October, 1883, Legislative Council Paper No. 124, of 1883, the details of a sum of £15,900 for Special Public Works that had not been provided by Parliament are shown, and endeavours have subsequently been made in Parliament, without success, to pass a vote for the purpose of providing this amount by Loan Act. By authority of the Governor in Council the item has been placed in suspense, and the Revenue Account temporarily relieved of a charge of £8496 1s. 3d. comprised in the original sum which had been carried to its debit. Definite action with regard to this matter will, it is hoped, be taken during the next Session.

The increase for the year being £708,400. In the Treasurer's Balance Sheet the amount is stated to be £3,357,300, being the balance of cash transactions at the end of the year, and would represent the first figures in the above table, with the addition of £300 for Debentures due but not presented for payment.

TRUST FUNDS.

Public Debts Sinking Fund.—This fund has increased from £86,038 2s. 6d. at the end of 1884, to £96,072 14s. 1d. on 31st December, 1885, £96,000 being invested in Government Debentures. The following are the transactions for the year 1885:—

The deductions made from members who remained in the force on 31st December, 1885, amounted to £1618 6s. 9d., so the balance at credit of the fund represented an increase of 20 per cent. on such deductions, owing to the earnings of interest and forfeitures of retiring members being distributed to the credit of those who remained.

Reward Branch.—The receipts of this Branch amounted to £641 10s. 9d., and the payments to £45, the balance at credit being £596 10s. 9d., of which £300 was invested at fixed deposit.

PUBLIC BODIES.

Municipal.—The accounts of the Municipalities have been examined and passed, all having been promptly rendered, except those for Glenorchy. In this case the accounts were, as usual, forwarded in a most unsatisfactory state, and they were completed and passed only a few days since.

Road Trusts.—Eighty-eight Road Trust accounts have been examined and passed. The accounts of the Port Cygnet Road Trust are in a most unsatisfactory state, and one of the Inspectors reports that upon a recent visit he found the books in great disorder; that the Trustees had issued orders for considerable amounts to contractors "payable when the Trust is in funds," which had not been shown as liabilities,

and that many of these orders had been cashed by the tradespeople in the township; that the contracts accepted were nearly all those of relations or connections of the Chairman, and some of the Trustees, and that he had every reason to believe that moneys had been injudiciously expended, if a worse term should not be used,—as the Trustees are appointed by the ratepayers; and as actual fraud has not been discovered, it is very difficult to find a remedy for this unsatisfactory state of affairs, unless the ratepayers take the matter in hand at the next election of Trustees.

Main Road Boards.—The accounts of these Boards, thirty-two, have been examined and passed. The Port Cygnet Board has been abolished by Proclamation of the Governor in consequence of abuses discovered.

Marine Boards.—The accounts of the five Marine Boards and of the Lighthouse Fund have been audited and published.

Cemetery Trust Accounts.—Seventeen Cemetery Trust Accounts have been examined and passed.

Sinking Funds.—The contribution due by the Fingal Municipality to the Treasury Account for the year 1884, and referred to in my last Report, has not yet been paid, nor has any amount been forwarded on account of the year 1885. The sinking funds accounts of the Campbell Town Water Trust and Latrobe Road Trust have been examined and found correct.

Miscellaneous.—The accounts of the Campbell Town Water Trust, Hobart Public Library, and Tasmanian Railways Registers of Receipts and Expenditure, have been examined and passed.

TASMANIAN MAIN LINE RAILWAY.

The accounts of the Tasmanian Main Line Railway for the year ending 31st December, 1885, have been audited, and a special report thereon was forwarded to you on the 28th May last by the Deputy Auditor.

Inspection of Accounts.

The Travelling Inspectors have been fully and usefully employed since my last report, having visited 31 Departments, 67 Post Offices, and 85 Public Bodies. Nine Departments have also been visited by the Chief Clerk.

COLONIAL STOREKEEPER'S ACCOUNTS.

The Colonial Storekeeper's Accounts were received on 15th June, and were examined, and a report was forwarded to you thereon on the 29th June. It is hoped that those for this year will be furnished earlier, as the new system is now in fair working order.

QUERIES AND LETTERS.

A list of queries and letters which have not been satisfactorily answered is given in Appendix B. Special reference is thought to be necessary with regard to Queries Nos. 234 and 258, and to Letters 16th March to 30th June; the correspondence is therefore added. I fully endorse the opinion of the Deputy Auditor in these cases.

My thanks are due to the Deputy Auditor, Mr. Alexander Reid, and to the Chief Clerk, Mr. J. W. Israel, for their valuable help in preparing this Report, as well as for the efficient and satisfactory manner in which the duties of this Department have been performed during my absence from the Colony.

Voucher 1393, January, 1886, £233 6s. 8d. Director of Public Works.—Interest paid to Fergus and Blair on sum of £5000, retained under contract for Mersey and Deloraine Railway.

The sum of £5000, retained in the hands of the Minister of Lands and Works, appears to have been placed at fixed deposit for a period of six months only, and interest amounting to £100 received thereon, but Messrs. Fergus and Blair have been paid £233 6s. 8d., or fourteen months' interest.

A loss of £133 6s. 8d. having been caused to the Government through the amount not being re-invested when the deposit became due, some fuller explanation than that already given seems to be necessary with regard to the non-investment.

It appears to the Deputy Auditor that the sum paid to Messrs. Fergus & Blair in excess of that earned and credited to the Vote cannot be considered a fair charge against moneys voted "for the purposes" of the Mersey and Deloraine Railway Act as defined by Section 3, and that a payment of such an exceptional nature requires the authority of the Governor in Council, and should be provided for on a Supplementary Estimate.

REPLY.

The item, £133 6s. 8d., (14 months' interest) must be considered as a part of the payment in full satisfaction of all claims against the Mersey and Deloraine Railway made by the contractors, Messrs. Fergus and Blair, and properly chargeable against the Vote.

The deposit had been invested for a period of two months beyond the contract date of completion, and was then carried to the credit of suspense account, there to await the repayment to the contractors, and it was quite impossible for this Department to fix the exact date when same might be required.

It was considered that, under Clause 28 of the conditions of contract, the contractor was entitled to interest on the sum held as security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

Referring to the accompanying Memorandum of the Director of Education of 14th May last,* addressed to the Engineer-in-Chief (which has been forwarded to this Office in connection with replies to Queries Nos. 226, 235, and 247), the Deputy Auditor would be glad to have a reference to the dates when the Parliamentary sanction was given for the items marked 1, 2, and 3. It has been usual in similar cases for the authority of the Governor in Council to contain an intimation that such approval had been obtained.

With regard to the other portion of Mr. Stephens' Memorandum, and which applies to the remaining

items in this Query, the Deputy Auditor begs to point out—

1st. That Section 2 of 45 Vict. No. 27 provides that when the estimated cost of any school-house exceeds Five hundred Pounds the erection shall not be proceeded with unless Parliament shall approve of the same.

2nd. That Section 1 of 44 Vict. No. 6 defines the term "school-house" as including the teacher's dwelling attached thereto and all necessary buildings in any case where the Governor-in-Council determines that a school-house shall be erected with such dwellings and buildings.

He therefore submits that as the total estimated cost of each of these school-houses exceeded £500, sanction of Parliament should have been obtained before their erection. The fact of tenders having the sanction of Parliament should have been obtained before their erection.

been taken separately for the schoolroom and teacher's residence does not appear to him to affect the question, inasmuch as the two together make up the "school-house."

The Deputy Auditor would also suggest that in future when any authority of the Governor in Council is obtained for the erection of school-houses, an intimation should be at once forwarded to the Treasury (for transmission to the Auditor), as is the case with all other authorities. The plan hitherto adopted of keeping back the authorities until asked for by the Audit Office is very unsatisfactory, and the cause of unnecessary

A reference to the authority of the Governor-in-Council should also be given on each account to enable the Treasury to pass it.
