

TOLL-BARS ERECTED ON THE MAIN LINE OF ROAD.

Laid on the Table by Mr. Colonial Treasurer, and ordered by the House to be printed, 22 August, 1865.



TOLL-BARS, MAIN LINE OF ROAD.

Notice by Mr. Douglas.—The Cost of the several Toll-bars erected on the Main Line of Road during the past 12 Months, and the Increase of Tolls on the said Line of Road.

Replies thereto.—No Toll-bars have been erected on the Main Line of Road during the past 12 months; nor have any additional Toll-bars been proclaimed except the side bar in Parkstreet, to prevent the evasion of the Toll at New Town Bar, of which it forms a part. The cost of buildings erected on the Main Line of Road under Contracts entered into in 1863, and which were so erected under Resolutions of Parliament (vide same Paper No. 88, Second Session, 1863, brought up by Mr. Adye Douglas, and ordered to be printed, 2nd September, 1863), is fully set forth in Parliamentary Paper, 15th July, 1864, No. 40. Expenditure on Main Line of Road, page 11.

The buildings at Pontville and Breadalbane have not been proclaimed, nor are any Tolls authorised to be collected thereat; they are at present occupied as Stations for men employed in repairs of the Main Road and Telegraph.
