

#### MEMORANDUM.

WITH reference to the request to be furnished with an estimate of the probable cost of each of the proposed new School Buildings, a list is herewith transmitted showing the buildings proposed to be erected by the Board of Education, with the number of scholars to be accommodated.

Plans of the proposed Schools at Hobart (one), Wellington and Charles-street, Launceston, (two), and Beaconsfield (one), prepared by Mr. Hunter, are at present before the Legislative Council, together with the architect's estimate of the cost of each building.

To arrive at an estimate of the cost of each of the other school-rooms, it may be taken that £10 for each child to be accommodated will cover the expense of building when brick or stone are used in the erection thereof, and for permanent wooden buildings on stone foundations, £8 for each pupil to be accommodated; but these figures are liable to variation in different localities.

For teachers' residences much will depend upon the locality and the style of school-room, but an average of £350 for each may be taken as the outside cost.

## SUPERVISION OF ERECTION AND REPAIR OF SCHOOL-HOUSES.

Board of Education Office, Hobart, 31st March, 1881.

The Board of Education having in view the erection and repair of a large number of school buildings that must take place ere long, and the amount of public money that will necessarily be spent thereon, desire again to bring under the notice of the Government the advisability of making arrangements for placing the supervision of the works under the officers of the Public Works Department.

At present the Board,—except in the case of large country buildings or town repairs, when the services of an architect can be secured,—have to accept the report of a Chairman of a Local School Board, or other unprofessional man, as to the manner in which repairs, &c. have been carried out, a course which is obviously open to objection, but which the Board are helpless to remedy.

The officers of the Public Works Department are generally available throughout the Colony; and on the score of both economy and efficiency it would appear desirable to secure their services in the inspection of and report on the state of school buildings, and in the supervision of their erection or repair.

SIR,

I have the honor to transmit, for the information of the Government, the accompanying list of localities most urgently requiring school buildings.

The Board's Architect will be instructed to prepare detailed plans and specifications for the proposed two new schools in Launceston; and it is proposed that the rate of remuneration he will receive be  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. for the preparation of the necessary plans and specifications in detail.

For the supervision of the works during their progress, and certificate of the due performance of the contracts, arrangements will subsequently be made, subject to the approval of the Government.

The Board desire to urge upon the Government to take into consideration the desirability of the smaller schools being constructed under the management and supervision of the Public Works Department. A series of plans and specifications might be prepared, which would answer for schools to accommodate 25, 40, 60, 80 children, and so on. By this arrangement expense and trouble of preparing plans, &c. for each school would be avoided, and one plan could be used for several schools.

WITH reference to the two schools in Launceston, the Colonial Secretary wishes to be informed whether the usual charge of 5 per cent. will cover all expenses connected with the preparation of the plans and specifications and the subsequent supervision of the buildings during construction.

As far as I am concerned, I understand that Mr. Hunter would prefer the arrangement made with the Government that the Public Works Department should supervise the works during execution, and that he should receive 5 per cent. and travelling expenses for the full responsibility of the works.

The Memo. of the Chairman of the Board does not furnish a reply to the enquiry of the Colonial Secretary of the 23rd instant.

It is surely not intended that the Public Works Department should supervise the works during construction, and Mr. Hunter receive 5 per cent. and travelling expenses.

The Colonial Secretary is under the impression that Mr. Conway, of Launceston, has proposed to the Board to undertake the supervision of the works; and he would like to know, if such is the case, the terms of Mr. Conway's offer?

The proposal made by me, to the effect that the Public Works Department should supervise the works during their construction arose from a conversation I had with Mr. Hunter; and I understood from him that the projected buildings for the General Hospital would be supervised in that way, and that he would receive full professional charges for the responsibility involved.

I am of opinion that 5 per cent. should be made to cover all expenses of plans and supervision; and if it can be arranged that the Public Works Department inspect and supervise the works during their progress, at least half of this amount could be saved. The terms of Mr. Hunter's engagement with the Board as architect are  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. for plans and  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. for supervision, and travelling expenses when the distance exceeds five miles from Hobart.
