



MINUTES of Proceedings of the EXECUTIVE COUNCIL having reference to Pensions or Compensations for Loss of Office granted by the Governor in Council since the last Session of Parliament.

FRIDAY, 28TH NOVEMBER, 1862.

MINUTE, No. 419.

HIS Excellency in Council grants a Pension, at the rate of £50 per annum, to Mr. G. T. Smith, late 3rd Clerk in the Customs' Department at Hobart Town.

Also, to Thomas Downe, late Constable, Compensation for loss of Office at the rate of £3 16s.; to Mr. Charles Arthur, late Visiting Magistrate at Longford, Compensation for loss of Office at the rate of £36 2s. 2d.; and to Mr. R. Blythe, late Resident Stipendiary Magistrate of Sorell, Compensation for loss of Office at the rate of £27 1s. 8d.
