



MINERS, FINGAL.

APPLICATION FOR ROADS.

Laid upon the Table by the Colonial Treasurer, September 28, 1869; and ordered by the House to be printed.



Fingal, 20th September, 1869.

We the undersigned, being holders of Miner's Rights, Claimholders, and otherwise engaged in attempting to open up the Quartz Reefs around Tower Hill, both on private property and Crown land, with a view to develope the auriferous wealth of this Country, beg leave to represent the difficulty at present in our way by reason of the impracticable character of the country, and the necessity of forming a road for wheels before machinery and other requisites can be conveyed to that locality.

We would also urge the advisability of at once completing the road already partially made between Fingal and Mangana; and therefore beg leave respectfully to call the attention of the Government to the subject, in the earnest hope that they will take such measures as may be deemed necessary to assist our efforts, and further an object of such vital national importance.
