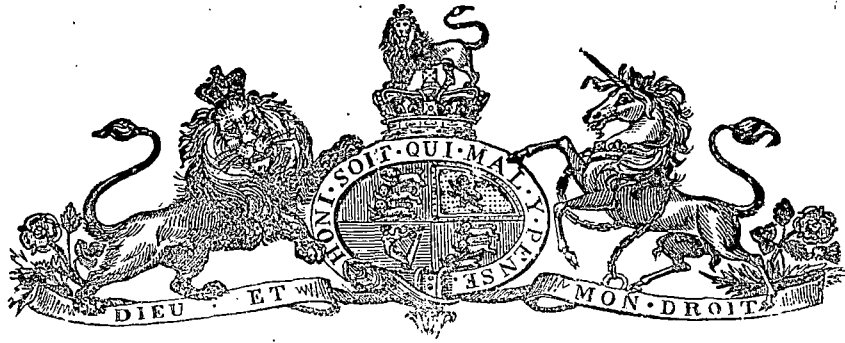

ANNUAL REPORT for 1875.

Invalid Depot, Launceston, 19th February, 1876.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to forward the usual Annual Report for this Institution for the year 1875.

On the 1st January, 1875, the number of inmates was	126
Admitted during the year	114
	240
Discharged during the year	95 } 119
Died	24 }
	121
Remaining on the 31st December, 1875	121
Daily average number	123
Average age of inmates	66 years.

Of those discharged 33 were transferred to Hobart Town on account of the insufficiency of the accommodation in this Institution, 4 to General Hospital; and 4 to Police Office for breach of regulations.

Only one hundred and ten cases of sickness occurred during the year.

The average age at the time of death was 70 years.

The conduct of the inmates has been, with few exceptions, good.

The rations, &c. supplied by various contractors were good.

Appended is a statement showing the expenditure for the year, and the average cost per head.
