
## TASMANIÁ. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

## LAND, &c. TRANSFERRED TO THE COLONY:

DESPATCH FROM SECRETARY OF STATE.

Return to an Address dated October 21, 1880. (Mr. Aikenhead.)

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Moore, and ordered by the Council to be printed, October 26, 1880.

Sir.

WITH reference to Mr. Weld's Despatch, No. 44, of the 31st of July, 1879, respecting the proposed surrender to the Government of Tasmania of certain fortifications, works, buildings, and land situate in the Colony, and held in trust for the defence thereof, I have the honor to transmit to you for your information, and for communication to your Government, the accompanying Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 18th of March, giving effect to the transfer in question.

Whereas it has been represented to Her Majesty by the Right Honorable Sir Michael Edward Hicks Beach, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, that it is expedient by Order in Council, pursuant to "The Colonial Fortifications Act, 1877," to vest in the Governor of the Colony of Tasmania the fortifications, works, buildings, and land hereinafter specified, being situate in the said Colony, and held in trust for the defence thereof, and the care and disposal of the said fortifications, works, buildings, and land, together with all estate and interest therein:

And whereas the said representation was laid before both Houses of Parliament, and lay for not less than Forty days on the Table of both Houses before it was submitted to Her Majesty:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty doth order, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance of the powers vested in Her by "The Colonial Fortifications Act, 1877," as follows:—

- 1. The several fortifications, works, buildings, and land enumerated in the Schedule hereunder written, and the care and disposal thereof, and the freehold thereof, shall be, and the same are hereby vested in the Governor of the Colony of Tasmania in fee simple for the public purposes of the said Colony.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Tasmania Fortifications Order, 1879.
