



PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

LAND FOR NATIVE BORN AND OTHERS:

PETITIONS FOR GREATER FACILITIES OF ACQUIRING.

Ordered by the House of Assembly to be printed, September 17, 1884.



To the Honorable the Speaker and Honorable Members of the House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, in Tasmania.

The Petition of the undersigned Inhabitants of Campbell Town,

HUMBLY SHOWETH:

That Petitioners feel aggrieved at the manner in which the Waste Lands of the Crown are being disposed of and alienated to parties who are strangers to the Colony, and who have conferred on them facilities and privileges which are refused to the native born and long residents in the Colony.

Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray that greater facilities than are now afforded under the present Waste Lands Act be accorded the native born and long residents in Tasmania for acquiring a homestead in their native land or adopted country, whilst there is a remnant left.

And Petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
