Legislation and Regulatory Review (Premier and Cabinet) Bill 2026

The Legislation and Regulatory Review (Premier and Cabinet) Bill 2026 (the Bill) gives effect to the Department of Premier and Cabinet's component of the Tasmanian Government's commitment to hold a Legislative Repeals Day in the August-September Parliamentary session.

The Bill amends the *Public Works Committee Act 1914* by inserting the transitional provisions of the *Public Works Committee Amendment Act 2009* into section 32A.

The Bill makes the following repeals:

- *Australia Acts (Request) Act 1999* (No. 37 of 1999)
- *Public Works Committee Amendment Act 2009* (No. 21 of 2009)

In addition, the Bill revokes the following instruments:

- *Proclamation under the Constitution Act 1934* (No. 1 of 1999)
- *Proclamation under the State Service Amendment (Performance) Act 2011* (No. 83 of 2011)
- *Proclamation under the Parliamentary (Disclosure of Interests) Amendment Act 2017* (No. 89 of 2017)

These amendments remove obsolete or duplicative provisions and instruments, tidying up legislation within the Premier portfolio.

The Act will commence on the day on which the Act receives the Royal Assent.

Administration of this Act is assigned to the Premier. The Department responsible to the Premier for the administration of this Act is the Department of Premier and Cabinet.
