
PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

Petition to President and Honorable Members of Legislative Council of Tasmania.

We, the undersigned women in the employment of Messrs. Johnstone Bros. & Co., Woollen Manufacturers, of Hobart, do humbly pray that you will allow us to work the same number of hours as we are working at the present time,—namely, Fifty-four hours per week,—as we consider if "The Women and Children Act" as now proposed becomes law that it will be a great hardship on us, as we only get paid what money we earn, and to take six hours from us each week will compel us to try and get some extra work to do at home in the evenings.

And your Petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
