



# MUNICIPAL POLICE:

INSPECTOR'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1887.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.

STR.

I HAVE the honor to submit my Annual Report upon the Police appointed for the several Municipalities within the Colony for the year 1887, in accordance with Section 7 of "The Police Regulation Act, 1865."

Since the date of my last Report I have completed the inspection of the whole of the Municipalities. I regret, however, to state I found it impossible to personally visit and inspect every outstation, having deemed it advisable to devote the time at my disposal to first visiting those of the Territorial Police, such being more immediately under my charge, and in which I am, therefore, more interested.

The Municipal Councils continued to maintain a sufficient staff for the preservation of the peace, and for the prevention and detection of offences within their own borders. General good order was secured, and there was a very great diminution in the number of persons charged with drunkenness and minor offences, whilst the charges of a more serious nature were less than the average of some years past. The "maintenance of general police communication and uniform organisation throughout the Colony," also enjoined by the Act, could not, as I pointed out in my last Report, from the nature of the constitution of the Municipalities, be carried into effect.

The reference made in my last report to the failure of some Municipal officers to avail themselves of the facilities afforded by the *Police Gazette* to publish information as to offences and offenders, with particulars and description of stolen property, and other details calculated to lead to the more speedy detection of crime, appears to have had some effect in drawing attention to the subject, and reports for publication have since been received from quarters from whence they had not previously come. I regret, however, to say many offences are committed and some property stolen no report or description of which is sent in for publication, although it is well known the *Police Gazette* is printed weekly, and is immediately despatched to every Constable in the Colony. It seems incredible that officers of police taking any active interest in their work should fail to avail themselves of the facilities thus gratuitously placed at their disposal by the Government.

It affords me much pleasure to record the uniform courtesy I experienced during the year in my official relations with the Municipal Authorities, whilst a very general desire has been evinced by the officers and men of the Municipalities, with one marked exception, to work harmoniously with those of the Territorial Districts.

I append Returns and particulars of the Force relating to each separate Municipality, in the form in which they have been published for many years.

• Without uniform. The Superintendent has £230 as Council Clerk. All the Force have quarters, and the Superintendent and two Constables have forage. The Gaoler has fuel and light in addition to quarters.

• With uniform—except Specials. The Sub-Inspector, Sergeant, and two Constables have quarters. The Superintendent has £50 per annum as Council Clerk. The Superintendent and Sub-Inspector have forage.
