CONTAGIOUS DISEASES HOSPITAL, LAUNCESTON.

20th January, 1890.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to furnish the Annual Report of this Institution for the year 1889.

There remained on 1st January three patients, and forty-four were admitted during the year.

During the year forty-five patients were discharged, leaving two remaining on December 31, 1889.

Of those admitted nine were for the first time, twenty-six for a second time, and twelve more than three times.

Thirty-one were Protestants and sixteen were Roman Catholics.

Forty-one were natives of Tasmania, one of Victoria, one of New South Wales, two of New Zealand, one of England, and one of Ireland.

The ages varied from sixteen to forty-two, the average age being 22.38 years.

The average period of detention was 53.83 days.

The daily average number was 5.91.

The cost per head per annum was £39 4s.

Of those admitted during the year thirty-four could read and write, eight could read only, and five could not read.
