

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to submit my Annual Report upon the Police appointed for the several Municipalities within the Colony for the year 1894.

The Municipal Councils maintained sufficient Police, with necessary stations and watchhouses, to meet all requirements.

I was unable to visit the Municipalities, with the exception of Launceston, during the year, in consequence of having been called upon on 19th July, 1894, to undertake the duties of Police Magistrate of Hobart. Arrangements are now made under which my usual visits will not be interfered with in future.

I append particulars of the Police Establishment of each Municipality in detail, and I also attach the usual Returns of Offences furnished by the several Municipal Officers.
