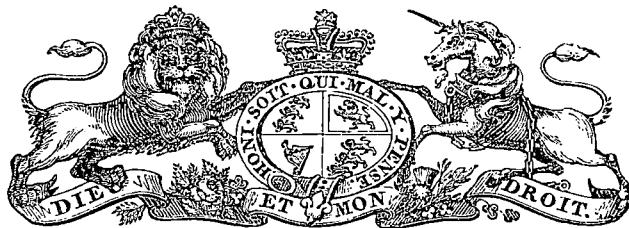

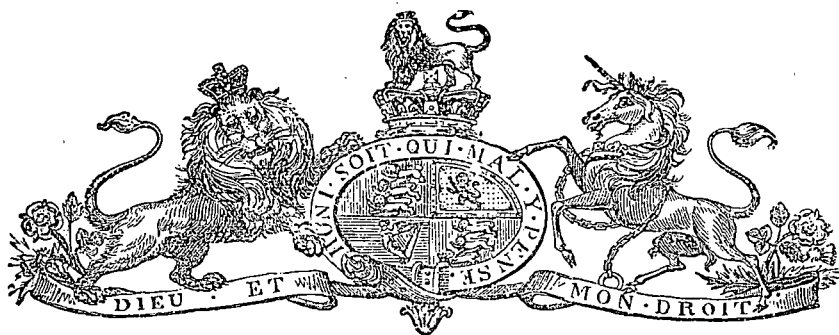

## GIRLS' TRAINING SCHOOL REFORMATORY.

### REPORT for 1885.

Hobart, 24th March, 1886.

SIR,

THE Ladies' Committee of the Girls' Training School Reformatory are glad to be able to report that the work of the Institution has gone on quietly and steadily throughout the past year.

By the exercise of careful economy they are in a position to state that the Institution continues to be self-supporting, while from special donations they have a sum of £218 14s. 9d. towards a Building or Reserve Fund.

The average number of inmates for the year has been twelve, and their behaviour on the whole good. Six girls were admitted during the year, and nine left. Some of the latter are doing well in situations; two were discharged by order of the Chief Secretary. The girls are employed in washing, housework, cooking, and needlework, and receive Bible lessons and instruction in reading and writing.

The amount earned during the year by washing was £325 2s. 3d.

The Committee desire to record their appreciation of the untiring energy and devotion of the Matrons, which has helped so materially towards the success of the Institution.
