



PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

FIRE BRIGADE BOARD, HOBART:

REPORT FOR 1884.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



REPORT of the Fire Brigade Board, Hobart, for the Year ending 31st December, 1884.

The under-mentioned gentlemen were appointed to constitute the Board by Gazette Notice of 24th March, 1884; namely,—Messieurs Benjamin Travers Solly, William Belbin, Charles Harbottle, John Roberts, and Crawford Mayne Maxwell; and on the same date Mr. Edward Maher was appointed Superintendent.

At the commencement of operations this Board was saved a considerable outlay in consequence of the very liberal gift from the Associated Fire Insurance Companies, consisting of engines, reels, plant, and fire-bell tower.

There have been 16 fires and 10 alarms during the past year. Two fires occurred on uninsured premises, and the expenses incurred in attending these were recovered from the owners of the properties, as provided for by "The Fire Brigades Act, 1883."

The expenses of the year amount to £531 18s. 4d., less amount received for sale of old hose and expenses recovered, equal to £8 9s., leaving the net expenditure at £523 9s. 4d., which has been divided equally between the Government, the Corporation, and the Insurance Companies. Statement of Receipts and Expenditure is annexed.

Schedule of Fires and Alarms is also annexed.

Telephonic communication has been established between the Police Station, the Superintendent's residence and Engine Station, the Fire-bell, and the Reservoir in Lansdowne Crescent near the Marquis of Hastings Hotel. Battery Point will be connected with the fire-bell very shortly.

The Board have endeavoured to keep down the expenses as much as possible, having due regard to the efficiency of the Brigade, which consists of 18 men under the Superintendent.

The Superintendent reports the Plant of the Brigade as being in good order.
