To the Honorable. the House of Assembly of Tasmania.

The humble Petition of the undersigned Electors of Hobart Town and others.

HUMBLY SHOWETH :

THAT, by the third Section of the new Licensing Bill, it is proposed to admit of Manufacturers' Licences being issued authorising the holders thereof to sell Cider, Perry, and Wine from apples, pears, or other fruit grown in the Colony, in quantities not less than twenty-five gallons at any one time.

That your Petitioners venture humbly to submit that the prohibition of the Sale of Colonial-made Wines or Perry in any smaller quantity than twenty-five gallons will operate prejudicially upon the manufacture of Colonial-made Liquors.

Your Petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that your Honorable House will take the premises into your consideration with a view to reducing the quantity so allowed to be sold; and your Petitioners will ever pray, &c.
