

# ANNUAL REPORT of the Tasmanian Council of Education for the Year 1879-80.

To His Excellency SIR FRANCIS SMITH, Knight, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

# MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

1. In conformity with the provisions of "The Tasmanian Council of Education and 22Vict. No. 21, Scholarship Act," we have the honor to submit this our Twentieth Report of the proceedings of the Council from the 1st May, 1879, to the 30th April, 1880.

- 2. The Rev. George Clarke was elected President for the year ending 30th June, President. 1880.
- 3. We caused an Examination of Candidates for the Council of Education Exhibitions to be held in the month of June, 1879. Seven Students presented themselves for examination; and, on the recommendation of the Examiners, Exhibitions of the annual Gazette. value of £20 each for four years were awarded to Henry Clissold Davenport, pupil of Rev. R. D. Poulett-Harris, M.A., High School, Hobart Town, and George Ernest Clemons, pupil of the Rev. W. H. Savigny, M.A., Church Grammar School, Launceston. Two others obtained a standard of marks sufficient to entitle each of them to an Exhibition.

Recognising the great advantages of these Exhibitions, we have unanimously passed the following resolution, and urged upon the Government to provide for the proposed additional Exhibitions in the Estimates for 1881:-

"In order to enable the Council to give five Exhibitions annually instead of two, the Government be requested to place £100 yearly instead of £40 at the disposal of the Council. The said Exhibitions to be open alike to girls and boys."

4. The Twentieth examination for the Degree of Associate of Arts was held in Degree of December, 1879; the Rev. J. E. Bromby, D.D., Melbourne, being Examiner in English, Associate of Arts, Gazette Latin, Greek, French, Pure Mathematics, Natural Philosophy, Geology, Chemistry, Notice, 6th Zoology, and Botany; the Rev. Thos. Kelsh, Examiner in Italian; J. A. Jackson, Esq., B.A., Examiner in German; and Henry Hunter, Esq., Examiner in Drawing.

Twenty-five Candidates under nineteen years of age presented themselves; all passed the Preliminary Examination, and twenty two greeneded in obtaining the Degree. the Preliminary Examination, and twenty-two succeeded in obtaining the Degree: fourteen being placed in the First Class, two in the Second Class, and six in the Third Class.

- 5. Two Candidates over nineteen years of age presented themselves for examination, one succeeded in obtaining the Degree, being placed in the First Class.
- 6. Charles Seymour Dowdell, as Senior Associate of the year, received the Council's Gold Medal; he also gained First Prize for English, and a Prize for Natural Philosophy and Prizes were awarded to the under-mentioned Associates, who were placed in the First Class, as follows:—Percy Leslie Waterhouse, Prize for Geology. John Warnock, First Prize for Italian. Claude William Rock, First Prizes for Latin, Greek, and Mathematics. Thomas William Cole, Second Prize for Greek. Eleanor Mary Poulett-Harris, Second Prizes for English and French, and a Prize for Music. Josiah Charles Eagle Knight, First Prize for French. Ernest Henry Waldemar Wolfhagan, First Prize for German. Allan John Baxter, Second Prize for Mathematics.

The Examiner-in-Chief in his Report observes:-

"The Examiner-in-Chief, on closing the labours of the Examination, has much pleasure in bearing testimony to the large amount of preparatory study which must have been given to attain this most satisfactory result. The only drawback to the pleasure experienced in the examination is that several candidates, who have evidently been making most praiseworthy efforts to attain excellency, have failed to do themselves full justice from accidental causes, such as mistaking the question, or what would appear to be a temporary confusion of memory. Other candidates have shown themselves too aspiring in the number of extra subjects brought up, such as Chemistry and Zoology. If a subject is too hastily crammed, but little good is effected; for the facts are sure to fade away rapidly from the memory."

Tasmanian Scholarships, Gazette Notice, 6th January,1880. 7. The Examination for Tasmanian Scholarships in December last was conducted by the Revds. J. E. Bromby, D.D., and J. C. Whall, M.A. Five candidates presented themselves; one—George Alexander Webster, A.A., 1877, reached the standard prescribed by the Council. A Scholarship was awarded to him, and he has since proceeded to Great Britain to enter upon his University studies.

Scholars' progress.

8. Of the progress of the Tasmanian Scholars since the publication of our last Annual Report we learn that Mr. Alfred Doran, Tasmanian Scholar of 1875, took his B.A. Degree in March last, obtaining a fourth place in the Second Class in the Classical Tripos. Mr. Francis Leicester Butler, Tasmanian Scholar of 1874, took his Degree of B.A. in Michaelmas Term, 1879, and obtained a Third Class in Honors in the Jurisprudence Examination. He also passed in Roman Law at the General Examination of Students of the Inns of Court in April, 1879, and his final examination for call to the Bar in April last; he has since been called. Mr. James W. Tibbs, a Tasmanian Scholar of the same year, has also taken his B.A. Degree, and has received an appointment to a Mastership in St. Edward's School, Oxford. The Rev. J. W. H. Geiss, Tasmanian Scholar of 1871, has recently returned to the Colony.

Minor Scholarships. 9. The two Minor Scholarships at the disposal of the Council for this year were awarded to Charles Seymour Dowdell and Percy Leslie Waterhouse, who stood first and second respectively on the list of Associates of the year, they having intimated their intention to study and compete for a Tasmanian Scholarship. The Scholarships are each of the value of £40 per annum, and are tenable for two years.

Dry Scholarship. 10. The Dry Scholarship was awarded to Charles Seymour Dowdell, Senior Associate of the year, he having announced his intention of studying for the Tasmanian Scholarship Examination.

Local Examination for Matriculation at Melbourne University.

11. Since the publication of our last Report two examinations of candidates for Matriculation at the University of Melbourne have been held in Hobart Town under our supervision, with the following results:—2nd February Term, 1879—Two candidates. One, John Edgar Wolfhagan, passed both the Matriculation and the Civil Service Examination. October Term, 1879—Five candidates. Three failed; two, Walter Philip Blackmore and James Arthur Warnock, passed both the Matriculation and the Civil Service Examination; and Francis Henry Stephenson, though failing in the Matriculation Examination, succeeded in passing the Civil Service Examination.

12. The Fifth Examination for the Scholarship of £100 per annum for three years, offered biennially by the Trustees of the Gilchrist Education Trust to the youth of this Colony, commenced on the 28th July last, and extended over five days. Three Candidates presented themselves. The papers worked by them, under our supervision, were forwarded under seal to the Authorities in England; and a communication was subsequently received notifying that one of the Candidates, Arthur Frederick Davenport, A.A., 1877, had been successful in gaining the Scholarship.

13. We have framed the following Rules to form part of Sections 18 and 25 Rules for computing ages of respectively of our Regulations, and have duly obtained the approval of the Governor in Candidates for Council thereto:-

# DEGREE OF ASSOCIATE OF ARTS.

# To form part of Section 18.

The first day of September in the year 1879, and first day of September in the year 1880, are hereby fixed and appointed as the days upon which the ages of Candidates for the Degree of Associate of Arts shall in each of such years be ascertained and computed.

# TASMANIAN SCHOLARSHIPS.

# To form part of Section 25.

The first day of September in the year 1879, and the first day of September in the year 1880, are hereby fixed and appointed as the days upon which the ages of Candidates for the Tasmanian Scholarships shall in each of such years be ascertained and computed.

14. Vacancies were created by the retirement of the Right Rev. the Bishop of Vacancies. Tasmania, and by the decease of the Hon. Sir James M. Wilson, K.C.M.G. These vacancies have been filled by the election of James Grant, Esq., and Russell Young, Esq.

15. We submit a Statement of the Disbursements of the Council between the 1st Financial year and the 31st December 1879, the termination of the financial year together Statement. January and the 31st December, 1879, the termination of the financial year, together with a Supplementary Statement of Payments between the 1st January and the 30th April, 1880. The total expenditure under every head for the year 1879 is shown to have amounted to £2240  $2\hat{s}$ . 5d.

16. We append to our Report a Roll of the Tasmanian Scholars, a List of those Appendices Students who have obtained the Degree of Associate of Arts, and a List of those who A, B, & C. obtained Exhibitions offered by the Council.
