

ROAD & BRIDGES from the Township of Upway to the Gold-fields at Waterhouse, including a Bridge over the Great Forester River and the Road through Stephenson's Marsh; and a Road from the Landing Place at the Tomahawh to the Gold-fields at Waterhouse; and also a Trach from Tucker's Corner to Waterhouse, &c.

#### Vote-£2500.

The works on the George Town road at the Fourteen-mile Creek, referred to in last Report, have since been completed under contract of Messrs. Barrett Bros. at £120.

A contribution of £75 has also been paid in aid of works on this road, which were carried out under arrangements made by the Committee of the Nine-Mile Springs Gold-fields Road Trust,—a similar sum having been subscribed by the various Companies interested.

#### ROAD TO MOUNT BISCHOFF (TIN MINES).

#### Supplementary Estimate.

The Bridges over the Wey and Hellyer Rivers, on the road to Mount Bischoff, referred to in last Report, have been completed under M. Boland's contract, after which it was found necessary to cut road and construct approaches thereto; and as the summer was fast advancing, it was essential that this should be done at once, or the Bridges would have been useless. For these works the Contractor for the Bridges wanted £378 2s. 4d.; but his tender was declined, and an arrangement made with the Mount Bischoff Tin Mining Company to carry out the same on the understanding that the Government would give £150 towards it, the Company and those interested to find the rest.

The approaches as specified have been completed by the Company at a total cost of £301 4s. 3d., in addition to which the Manager states that considerable extra works had also to be done in connection therewith to render them complete; and the contribution of £150 in aid thereof has been paid.

#### BRIDGE OVER THE RIVER BLYTHE.—Supplementary Estimate.

Authorised by Governor in Council—£200.

This Bridge is on the Main Road, North West Coast, and was erected with others in 1862, under the Northern Board of Works, out of the vote of £12,000, sanctioned by Parliament for Roads and Bridges to open up Crown Lands.

Owing to the unsafe and dangerous state of the structure it was necessary, in order to maintain communication with Mount Bischoff, that immediate steps should be taken for its repair. A specification was therefore prepared, tenders invited, and that of Henry Jowett at £160, being the lowest, accepted. The work is almost finished.

# FOR DEFRAYING THE COST OF ERECTING A LINE OF TELEGRAPH FROM DELORAINE TO CIRCULAR HEAD,

And providing all Works and Appliances connected therewith.

#### VOTE-£4000.

The poles for this Line have been supplied under the several Contracts referred to in last Report, and the tender of Messrs. Good and Cullen for erecting the same at 2s. 6d. each, being the lowest, was accepted. This work, however, has not yet been satisfactorily completed by the Contractors, and men have been employed to do it at their cost.

The wire has been fixed as far as the Leven, under R. Miller's tender at 30s. per mile, although the same has not yet been done in terms of contract. R. Dargaville's offer for continuing this work to Table Cape, at the same rate, has been accepted; and Mr. Miller has undertaken to do the remainder for a like sum, with an additional allowance of £5 for extra cartage of heavier wire for portion of the line, and this arrangement has been sanctioned.

Communication has been opened to Latrobe, Torquay, Don, Forth, and the Leven, and the offer of Mr. R. Dargaville at £4 3s. 4d. per month accepted for keeping the line in working order from Deloraine to the Don, and temporarily at the same rate, in proportion to the distance, from the Don to the Leven, until a further section is completed.

For defraying the Cost of erecting a Line of Telegraph to Fingal and the Township of Mathinna, from the Main Line of Road at a place called Willis Corners, and providing all Works and Appliances connected therewith.

#### Vоте—£1500.

For Extension of Line from Fingal to St. Mary's. Vote-£500.

The poles for this line, between the Corners, Fingal, and Mathinna, have been supplied under contract of Messrs. Hamilton and Foster, referred to in last Report.

The offer of the contractors at the same rate for poles required for the extension of line to St. Mary's has been accepted.

The tender of Michael Fahey at £6 per mile, being considerably the lowest of several received, has also been accepted for erecting the poles and constructing line, including clearing, &c., from the Corners to St. Mary's, and the work is progressing.

For defraying the Cost of erecting a Line of Electric Telegraph from the proposed Station on the Main Line of Railway nearest to Richmond, or from the present Line of Telegraph to Richmond, and from thence to Sorell, Buchland, Spring Bay, and Swansea, and providing all Works and Appliances connected therewith.

#### VOTE-£2000.

Tenders were invited in July, 1874, for the supply of poles for this line, which was divided into six sections, and that of Messrs. W. C. Grubb and Bros., at 5s. 3d. each for 21 ft., and 5s. 9d. each for 24 ft. poles, being the lowest on the whole, was accepted, and they have satisfactorily completed their contract.

Tenders were also received in April last for erecting poles and constructing line, and that of W. C. Grubb, at 5s. 9d. per pole for Sections 1 and 2, and at £7 3s. 9d. per mile for the other portions, being the lowest, was accepted, and the work is being proceeded with. A saving of about £200 was effected in the cost of this line by utilising trees, where practicable, for poles.

It having been decided by Parliament that provision should be made in this structure to allow of the navigation of the river still being continued, the original plans, under which tenders were invited, had to be considerably altered for the introduction of a Swing Bridge; and Mr. Helmer (the lowest tenderer) was requested to make an offer for the work, with the alterations and additions referred to, which were clearly defined in specification and shown on plan.

His tender at £3475 being fair was recommended by the Promoters, and the acceptance thereof was duly authorised by the Governor in Council under date 15 February, 1875.

The Promoters appointed one of their number, Mr. Jno. Lloyd, to superintend the work; and the same is now being carried out. All the piles have been driven, and the piers are nearly completed.

The tender of M. Boland at £3220, received and recommended by the Promoters, as referred to in last report, was not accepted. A fresh design was then prepared in accordance with the suggestions and recommendation of this Department, and tenders invited. The lowest received was from J. Lobley and Co. at £1995 13s.; but the Contractors subsequently withdrew this offer, and fresh tenders were again called for, which resulted in that of Mr. W. Andrews at £1994 being accepted.

The Contractor has had to suspend building operations owing to the wet season and high state of the river, but has arranged for the supply of the necessary timber, and also for procuring from Melbourne blue stone for piers, some of which is now on the site.

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#### BRIDGE OVER THE RIVER DERWENT AT NEW NORFOLK.

After the date of last report a letter was received from the Promoters adopting the laminated principle; and a plan was prepared in this office and submitted to them.

The Promoters referred this design for the opinion of Mr. Grant, C.E., who reported unfavourably upon it, and afterwards, at their request, furnished a plan for the proposed structure, which was adopted by them in preference to the one from this office.

To this design I objected on the grounds—1st. That a Bridge in every way suited to the requirements of the locality could be constructed at a much less cost. 2nd. That the design in question required the use

of a great quantity of materials unnecessarily; and 3rd. That native timber is far preferable to imported pine, of which a considerable portion of the proposed Bridge was to be constructed.

#### BRIDGE OVER THE MEANDER AT DELORAINE.

The erection of this Bridge was postponed in consequence of the desirability of having the Mersey and Deloraine Tramway first laid out, as it was thought that one Bridge would answer the double purpose of Railway and ordinary traffic.

A considerable time elapsed before the vendors completed the sale of the Line to the Government, and till this was done no action could be taken as to survey, although an agreement had been entered into with Mr. Human for this purpose.

When the purchase of Line was completed, Mr. Human surveyed the site, and made a report as to Bridge, showing that two distinct structures would be necessary.

A copy of this report was sent to the Promoters, who requested Mr. Human to prepare a design for the proposed Bridge; but the course proposed by him being contrary to the meaning of the Local Public Works Act, could not be adopted; and I then offered to have a plan prepared and submitted to them, which offer the Promoters accepted.

Mr. Frith has since examined the site and conferred with Promoters as to best design; but as nothing could be done in the way of erection owing to the quantity of water in the river, which will not be down till November next, the matter was not further proceeded with. Plans, &c. will be ready by the end of the present month, when, if adopted, tenders can at once be invited.

#### BRIDGE OVER THE SOUTH ESK AT ENTALLY.

After the survey of the site had been made, and necessary particulars obtained, a design for this structure was prepared in this office, which was adopted by the Promoters.

Tenders were then invited for the work, but the lowest received being £5570, none were accepted. The reasons for the tenders being so much above the amount named for this work (viz., £4000) were, 1st.—Owing to the proposed Bridge being 8 feet above the level of the present structure, necessitating additional height of stone piers and considerable extra work in embankment; and, secondly, on account of the recent rise in the prices of materials and labour.

I informed the Promoters that the cost could be brought within the sum of £4000 or thereabouts, by substituting pile piers, or by constructing a pile Bridge on another principle; but they stated that the ratepayers would not hold themselves responsible for more than £3000.

I then requested the Promoters to submit a plan for the approval of the Governor in Council, to which they replied that the Road Trustees are repairing the old Bridge, and that the Promoters have no funds to pay for any plans.
