SIR,

I HAVE the honor to inform you that the Governor has been pleased to appoint you to be Keeper of the Public Offices in succession to Mr. Grahame, who retires at the end of the year.

Your Salary will be at the rate of £120 a year from the 1st January next, from which date you will also be found in quarters, fuel, and light. You will in the meantime, however, attend at this Office and place yourself under Mr. Grahame's directions in order that you may become acquainted with the duties of the office.
