

5. The sergeants and men in and near the two principal cities, Hobart and Launceston, regularly attended drill under competent instructors. They also went through a course of musketry instruction during the past year. The numbers attending the classes of instruction were as follows:—12 sergeants, 75 constables—Total 87. The total attendances were 1629 drills, or an average attendance of 18 drills per man.

7. The sum of £9464 6s. stood to the credit of the Superannuation Branch of the Police Provident Fund at the end of the year, and £250 to the Reward Branch. The Reward Branch was augmented during the year hy £523 14s., received as moiety of fines and penalties, and £1044 3s. 2d. was transferred to the Superannuation Branch, in accordance with the recommendation appearing in my last report; the Act passed in October (64 Vict. No. 18) sanctioning the transfer of any surplus in the Reward Branch to the Superannuation Branch.

Section 3 of the same Act covers the second recommendation contained in my last report in its provision that "it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Police to receive any sum or sums of money from any local body, company, or person, in return for any services rendered by any member or members of the Police Force, and every such sum of money shall be paid into and form part of the said Superannuation Fund.

The detail receipts and expenditure under this head appear in Appendix B.

The Police Provident Fund Board, consisting of the Hon. the Attorney-General (Chairman), the Statistician, and the Commissioner of Police, held their first meeting on 16th June, at which the Commissioner of Police and the Statistician were appointed a sub-committee to draw up Regula-

tions to be submitted to the Hon. the Attorney-General.

To accord with the provisions of "The Police Regulation Act," 62 Vict. No. 48, several additions and amendments were required to be made in former Regulations. The Regulations so amended were approved by the Governor-in-Council, and published during the year. (Vide Hobart Gazette, 1900, pages 1682 and 2099.)

The systematic police patrol throughout the State, and the constant meeting of the men of Mounted the different districts is still maintained. This course cannot but commend itself to the public, as Police Duty. well as being beneficial to the police service generally. It is gratifying to direct attention to the superior class of horses now in the service, which enables the above work to be satisfactorily performed.

9. The total expenditure of the department for the year amounted to £37,451 15s. 10d., as Expenditure. against £39,330 11s. 11d. for the preceding year. Detail under separate headings will be found in Appendix C. Appendix C.

10. Appendix D. shows the number of offences reported to the police during the year, compared Criminal with those reported during the two preceding years. Appendix E., the number of persons proceeded against during the year, and the results of such proceedings. In the year 1900, 4349 persons D. and E. were proceeded against for various offences, as compared with 3809 during 1899, or an increase of

11. Eighty-three totalisator licences were issued under the provisions of "The Lotteries Amend-ment Act, 1899." The race meetings held were generally well conducted, and the reports of the Appendix F. Government Supervisors of Totalisators show the machines to have been satisfactorily worked.

Reference to Appendix F. will show that the sum of £77,556 15s. was passed through the machines. The percentage payable to the Treasury amounted to £474 2s. 7d., and the cost of supervision, £131 4s. 5d.

12. Proceedings taken under the Licensing Act, 53 Vict. No. 37, are shown in Appendix H. A large increase in the prosecutions will be observed for Sunday trading, viz., 45, as against 20 in the previous year.

POLICE PROVIDENT FUND, 1900.

SIR.

I HAVE the honour to submit a Statement of the Accounts of the Superannuation Branch and the Reward Branch of the Police Provident Fund for transmission to the Auditor-General, and supply the following particulars under the headings of Compensation Allowances and Rewards paid:—

Superannuation Branch.—T. Ballanie, £152 10s. 6d. This contributor retired consequent upon ill health, and under Regulation 8 became entitled to the whole amount to his credit. W. L. Shegog, £10 13s. 5d. Upon departure for service in South Africa this contributor was allowed to draw the whole amount to his credit. J. Armstrong, £112 2s. 3d., W. H. Paice, £144 1s. 8d., A. Ward, £132 8s. 5d, These contributors being members of the Fund for over 17 years, and having resigned, were each entitled to draw the whole amount to credit. The sum of £1044 3s. 2d. was, under the provisions of 64 Vict. No. 18, transferred from the Reward Branch and apportioned in accordance with Government Notice 394, resulting in the remaining members receiving (with forfeitures) 17s. 7d. for each pound of contributions for the current year.

Reward Branch.—J. D. and C. S. each £3 6s. 8d. These payments were made for services rendered re detection of illegal sale of liquor, West Coast. Sub-Inspector S. Weston, £3; Constable T. Egan, £5; Constable C. Egan, £3. These amounts were awarded in recognition of arduous services in connection with the Mount Arrowsmith disaster. £1044 3s. 2d. transferred and dealt with as above stated.

Investments.—During the year £5305 16s. 5d. invested in Local Inscribed Stock, and in the Commercial Bank £2900 at fixed deposit will shortly mature, and will be reinvested in Local Inscribed Stock. £200 also invested in Government Debentures inaturing in year 1913 (Superannuation Branch.) Reward Branch.—During the year £100 invested at fixed deposit with Commercial Bank, and £206 in Local Inscribed Stock. The £100 having now matured, payment has been made to the Treasury to extinguish the Dr. Balance appearing.
