



PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

NEW TOWN FARM:

REPORT FOR 1888.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



NEW TOWN FARM.

31st January, 1889.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to forward herewith the annual Report and Account Current of the New Town Farm for the year 1888.

The gross receipts for the year amounted to £925 7s. 1d.; the expenditure for that period was £710 16s. 3d., leaving a balance in favour of the Farm of £214 10s. 10d.

During the year the Government decided to reduce the price of the milk supplied to the various Institutions from 4d. per quart to 3d. per quart from the 1st of September, 1888. The quantity of milk supplied during that four months was 17,111 quarts, which, at 1d. per quart, would have realised £71 5s. 10d. more than is shown in these returns. In addition to this reduction it was also decided to make a nominal charge for the labour performed by the thirteen invalid men who assist on the Farm, at the rate of 6d. per day each man from the 1st October last, thus debiting the Farm with the further charge of £29 18s.

The loss in consequence of the reduction on the cost of milk and the charge for invalid labour together amounted to £101 3s. 10d., which, if added to the balance in favour of the Farm, would increase it to the amount of £315 14s. 8d.

It may be noticed that a larger charge than usual has been made for repairs to the Farm-buildings; this was necessary in order to prevent the fences and buildings from falling into dilapidation. The Farm-house was re-shingled and the fences generally repaired, and they are now in a good state of repair.

The 100 acres which comprise the Farm were cropped as follows:—25 acres of hay, 5 acres of wheat, 5 acres of green food, 5 acres of barley, and 6 acres mangel wurzel now in crop, estimated to yield 150 tons, the remainder being under grass and fallow. The hay, estimated at about 50 tons, was stacked in very good order. The wheat was an excellent crop, and has been estimated at about 40 bushels to the acre.

The live stock on the 31st December, 1888, was as follows:—5 horses, 1 bull, 31 cows, 39 pigs. During the year five new cows were purchased, and are of excellent quality.

The breeding of the pigs continues to have every attention, the sales for the year amounting to £100 14s. 3d. I estimate the value of the stock and crop on the 31st December, 1888, at £750.

The demand for milk throughout the year was very heavy, and every exertion was made to keep up as large a supply as possible, and was attended with success.

The work of the farm was performed satisfactorily throughout the year.
