

Tasmanian Public Library, Hobart, 28th February, 1885.

Sir,

THE Trustees of the Tasmanian Public Library, in compliance with Clause 7 of the Act to provide for the Incorporation and Government of that Institution (34 Vict. No. 27), beg to submit the following Report of its working during the year 1884 :--

REPORT.

1. THE Trustees, in presenting their Fourteenth Annual Report, have to record that during the period under review 19,857 visits have been registered in the Visitors' Book. These figures do not, however, represent the actual number of visits paid to the Institution, as many visitors neglect to register their names. The Trustees have decided to adopt some other and more certain means of checking the attendance for the future.

2. During the year 322 volumes have been added by purchase and presentation, the Parliamentary grant in aid of the Institution having enabled the Trustees to make valuable additions to the Library and Reading Rooms. The erection of extra shelving accommodation has enabled the Librarian to re-arrange the books so that the latest additions to the Institution are readily available to visitors.

3. A supplementary Catalogue of the Works added to the Institution during the last fourteen years has been prepared by the Librarian, and 250 copies printed for circulation.

4. The Trustees have to acknowledge, with thanks, presentations received from His Excellency the Governor, from the Governments of the various Colonies, from kindred Institutions in England, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, and New Zealand, and from Miss Higginbotham, Mrs. W. Lewis, Anson Bros., and Messrs. R. Walker, J. B. Walker, J. R. M'Clymont, H. J. Brown, and H. Britton.

5. The City Council has voted a sum of $\pounds 448$ for Library purposes for the year 1885, the estimated expenditure being as follows :---

T. be provided for by contribution from the Trustees (£75) and appropriation of Municipal Funds.

The Trustees were surprised to find that for the year 1885 the City Council had reduced the vote for the estimated expenditure on books, periodicals, and newspapers by $\pounds 60$, and requested a reconsideration of the vote in terms of a letter addressed to the Mayor and Aldermen, and published in the Hobart *Mercury* on 10th February, but, they regret to say, without avail.
