

To the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the Northern Tasmanian Licensed Victuallers Association,

SHOWETH:

That your Petitioners are Licensed Victuallers carrying on business in Northern Tasmania.

That your Petitioners respectfully pray that the following alterations and additions be made to "The Licensing Act, 1889":—

- 1st. To place all Clubs and other similar Institutions where Liquors are supplied to Members of same Clubs, and so forth, upon the same level as regards hours of closing.
- 2nd. That they be subject to a Licence of £25 per annum, and be required to comply with the Regulations of the Licensing Act.
- 3rd. That no Licence be granted to any Club that may be managed by one or more people for their personal benefit and profit.
- 4th. That all Licensed Victuallers b∈ privileged to recover debts in the same manner, and by the same proceedings, as other tradespeople.

And your Petitioners will, as in duty bound, ever pray, &c.
