

PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

CHIEF INSPECTOR OF SHEEP:

REPORT FOR 1884.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



REPORT OF CHIEF INSPECTOR OF SHEEP.

Office of Inspector of Sheep, Hobart; 30th June, 1885.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to furnish, for the information of the Government, the following Report of the Scab Act Department for the year ending 30th June.

A vacancy having occurred in the Department through the death of the late Chief Inspector, Mr. William Harrison, I was appointed to the position he had occupied. Mr. Malcolm Harrison has received an appointment on the Inspecting staff, and has the supervision of the Southern districts lately overlooked by me.

The sheep in Tasmania still remain clean, there being no reappearance of the disease known as Scab. This is a great boon to flockmasters, who are thereby saved considerable expense and annoyance. This much-desired result was accomplished by the discreet administration of the Scab Act by the late Hon. James Whyte, who alone can be credited with having exterminated the disease in Tasmania.

The present Act being erroneously named "The Scab Act, 1875," I would suggest to the Government the propriety of renaming the Act "The Sheep and Stock Act, 1885." There is ample reason for advocating this change, in view of the fact that persons in the other Colonies who are not aware of what has been done in the eradication of Scab are likely to be misled, and to suppose that the disease still exists when they hear and read that Inspectors having the title of "Inspectors under the Scab Act" are still employed.

Studmasters are now reaping the benefit of having a clean country, being able to export stud sheep to the whole of the Australian Colonies, where the high quality of their stock is greatly appreciated.

The following Table of number and Custom House value of stud sheep exported since 1870, inclusive, will show how greatly this industry has increased since the Scab Act first came into operation :—

What now presses heavily upon this important industry are the very stringent restrictions placed upon sheep from this Island landing in the adjoining Colonies. As an instance: New South Wales issued on 10th April, 1885, the following Regulation:—All sheep from Australian Colonies must be accompanied with a certificate, declared before a Justice of the Peace, showing that the sheep have been inspected one by one by the Chief Inspector and another Inspector, who certify to their being free from any infectious or contagious disease; that that part of the vessel where the sheep were penned has been thoroughly disinfected. This Regulation being complied with, the sheep are allowed to land into quarantine, and must remain there for 18 days before they can undergo one dipping and be released.

This, as you will perceive, is very detrimental to the breeding interest in Tasmania, and is likely to lead to difficulties if the Chief Inspector of Stock is, from causes over which he has no control, prevented from examining the sheep desired to be exported from Tasmania. In such an instance they would either have to be detained until the difficulty was overcome, or be shipped to New South Wales and there undergo a quarantine of 18 days prior to their being dipped three times at intervals of not less than 10 nor more than 15 days.

I may here remark that the Regulation issued by New South Wales is the cause of much loss of time to me, and a considerable amount of extra labour is involved, as shown by the July shipment of stud sheep for Sydney: for that shipment I inspected stud sheep on the properties of 33 different owners. By visiting the properties I can make a far more satisfactory inspection than inspecting at the ship; it saves the breeder considerable trouble, and the sheep themselves are not disturbed unnecessarily, as would be the case if inspected on shipboard or on the wharf.

I beg respectfully to draw your attention to the fact, that were our Regulations as stringent as that above mentioned it would amount to total prohibition of New South Wales fat stock.

New South Wales stock can be landed and sold (if required to pass outside the town boundary they can do so the same day) with one dipping, which is no hardship to shipper or purchaser. I regret extremely that the Government of New South Wales would not sanction the relaxation of their Regulations with reference to the importation of our stud sheep, which I consider is most desirable in the interest of both Colonies, as shown in a communication from the Premier of 9th May last, which was written at my instance, particularly as the last outbreak of Scab occurred in New South Wales only sixteen months since, and as a fact Tasmania has been free from Scab for seven years past, and was four years since declared by Proclamation a Clean Colony.

Tasmanian sheep have been exported to New South Wales for fifteen years past, and have never introduced Scab into the Colony.

I also beg to draw your attention to Regulation No. 126, bearing upon imported sheep for slaughter. Fat sheep from Victoria and New South Wales are allowed to land here, and are driven into the same pens at the Slaughter-yards that very possibly may be filled with our Colonial sheep the day following, and the latter would be subsequently allowed to travel unrestrictedly the length and breadth of the Island.

I would suggest that a Regulation be made providing that if any person purchases Colonial fat sheep and mixes them with imported sheep, the Colonial sheep should under no condition be separated from the imported ones for the purpose of being driven for sale to yards outside the town boundary without being first dipped.

I would also suggest that the Corporation at Hobart and Launceston be requested to erect yards at the Slaughter-houses for the sole use of imported fat sheep.

The sheep returns to date show 1,597,184, being 107,149 less than was reported in 1884; this decrease is owing in a great measure to there being no Autumn rain during last year to cause sufficient growth of grass for winter feed, consequently in the districts in which the largest number of lambs are usually returned the deficiency is enormous. The Returns show as under:—

On some of the properties situated within the Districts where the decrease is most perceptible I believe rabbits are the primary cause of the deficiency, it being an authenticated fact that you cannot breed lambs where rabbits, who will have the best and most succulent food, are numerous.

It is imperatively necessary that there should be an increase in the Inspecting staff. The duties cannot possibly be accomplished to the satisfaction of the Inspectors themselves or of the public. The work now is far in excess of the duties performed by six Inspectors in the days of

Scab; this is in consequence of the amalgamation of the Scab Act with the Rabbits Destruction Act and the Californian Thistle Act. The combined duties are being attempted by three Inspectors, having large and scattered Districts.

The Inspectors, from the fact of having to enforce the provisions of the above three Acts at times from information received, are obliged to hurry to some distant part of their District, and are thus compelled to neglect duties that, in some cases, require their immediate attention.

I am satisfied that if the contribution as asked for be consented to, the work will be performed in a more satisfactory manner. I wish particularly to bring under your notice that the amount derived from the contribution being only for the requirements of the Scab Act and Rabbits Destruction Act, is not to be absorbed in any way to carry out the provisions of the Californian Thistle Act.

The amount derived from the contribution of one farthing per head upon sheep for the year 1885 is insufficient to pay all demands upon the Scab Act Fund.

I beg to submit the appended estimate for 1886, fixing the contribution to be derived from the sheepowners for the working of the Scab Act and Rabbits Destruction Act at three-eighths of a penny per head on sheep, to be supplemented by one-eighth of a penny chargeable upon the Consolidated Revenue and paid to the credit of the Scab Act Fund, making the amount asked for equal to a half-penny per head on all sheep for the year 1886.

The sum so derived will enable me to increase the Inspecting staff to four Inspectors, also paying for the inspection and dipping supervision at Hobart, Launceston, Formby, and Stanley. This would considerably assist me by enabling me to utilize the four Inspectors in a greater measure to supervise the working of the Rabbits Destruction Act.

I beg to furnish you with the following information, extracted from the Annual Report of the Chief Inspector of Stock in New Zealand for the year ending 26th May, 1885, which shows a decrease in the number of infected sheep. The reduction that has been effected during the year is 204,943. It still leaves 108,995 infected sheep in that Colony, as shown in the Return annexed.
