



## CONTAGIOUS DISEASES HOSPITAL, LAUNCESTON.

6th February, 1888.

Sir,

I HAVE the honor to furnish the Annual Report of this Institution for the year 1887.

There remained on 1st January three patients; and thirty-six were admitted during the year.

Of those admitted, thirty were for the first time, five for second time, and one for the third time.

Twenty-three were Protestants, and sixteen were members of the Roman Catholic Church.

Thirty-five were natives of Tasmania, two of Victoria, one of New Zealand, and one of England.

The ages varied from fifteen to fifty-four, the mean being 22.853 years.

The average period of detention was 46.846 days; daily average number was 4.852; and the cost £33 14s.  $4\frac{1}{2}d$ . per head per annum.
