



PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

FIRE BRIGADE BOARD, HOBART:

REPORT FOR 1887.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



REPORT of the Fire Brigade Board for the City of Hobart for the Year ending the 31st December, 1887, made pursuant to Clause 13 of "The Fire Brigades Act, 1883."

During the past year the Brigade have attended at 27 fires, as shown in the Schedule annexed hereto. On all these occasions the men composing the Brigade have always performed their duties to the satisfaction of the Board.

The expenses for the year amount to £1206 17s. 6d., less expenses recovered and amounts unclaimed for assistance rendered, equal to £10 19s. 8d., leaving the net expenditure at £1195 17s. 10d., which has been equally divided between the Government, the Corporation, and the Insurance Companies. This amount is considerably in excess of the sum expended during the year 1886, and is accounted for by the fact that it was found necessary to erect a dwelling for the Fire Bell Station-keeper in Bathurst-street, the old building being utterly unfit for habitation. A substantial brick house has been built, at a cost of £559 13s. 6d., which has been tenanted by the Station-keeper for the last five months. A small quantity of new hose has also been procured from London, at a cost of £54 9s. 7d.

An Account setting forth the Receipts and Expenditure is attached to this Report.

The services of the Superintendent were sought by the Government to report on the best mode of making provision for the prevention of fires at the Hospital for Insane, New Norfolk. The Board are informed that his services have been much appreciated, and that many valuable suggestions have been made in his Report.

The Superintendent reports that the plant and appliances of the Brigade are in good order.

The Board has held 22 meetings during the year.
