

## BOARD OF IMMIGRATION:

REPORT FOR 1881.

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Moore, and ordered by the Council to be printed, July 12, 1882.



Immigration Office, 4th July, 1882.

Sir,

THE Board of Immigration have the honor to forward their Report for the year ending 31st December, 1881.

Under the arrangements entered into with the Orient Company, fifty-nine Bounty Immigrants were introduced during the year, consisting of ten married couples and a married woman coming out to join her husband, eleven single males, and thirteen single females, with five male and nine female children.

The cost to the Board for their introduction was £608.

Nine males and ten females came from England, seven males and twelve females from Ireland, eight males and eight females from Scotland, and two males and three females from Germany.

Land Certificates under the 7th section of the Act of Parliament, 31 Vict. No. 26, were issued to forty-eight individuals, entitling the holders to select two thousand five hundred and thirty acres of the Waste Lands of the Crown.

These Certificates represent thirty-five male and thirty-four female adults, and sixty-eight children,—in all one hundred and thirty-seven souls.

Eighteen Land Orders were issued under the 5th section of the same Act, entitling the holders to select or purchase six hundred and fifty-seven acres of the Waste Lands of the Crown. These Orders represented twenty male and eleven female adults and eleven children,—in all forty-two souls.

During the year the Board issued nineteen family, fifteen male, and twenty female Bounty Tickets. The Agents of the Board in London also issued two family, two male, and two female tickets.

The purchase money of these tickets amounted to £595.

The Board have again to express their regret at the absence of any book descriptive of the Colony and its resources, and also at the long delay in the preparation of a new map.

The absence of reliable information, general and statistical, relating to Tasmania, its present state and progress, by which the emigrating population of the mother country could become acquainted with the Colony and the inducements it offers to men of capital, as well as the artizan and labouring classes, has often been represented by the London Agents of the Board; and as the funds at the disposal of the Immigration Commissioners preclude their offering sufficient inducement to competent persons to compile such a work, the Board would again desire to press the consideration of this important subject upon the notice of the Government.

The balance at the disposal of the Board on the 31st December amounted to £3069 15s. 7d.

Appended are the usual Returns prepared by the Immigration Agent, five relating to the operations of the Board under the Bounty system, and two to transactions under the Acts of Parliament, 31 Vict. No. 26, and 38 Vict. No. 16.

A Statement is also appended showing the acreage selected and purchased by the holders of Land Certificates and Land Orders during the year 1881.
