I HAVE the honor to hand you herewith the usual annual statement of the working of the Tasmania-Victoria Cable for the year 1879.

You will observe that, in accordance with the Chairman's letter of May 15th, 1879, we have charged against the revenue of the past year the other moiety of the cost of laying down new shore ends to the cable. The benefit resulting from this heavy outlay is shown by the absence from the present accounts of any payments for repairs to cable.

It will be seen that the net receipts for last year yielded a return of only four per cent. on the capital invested in the cable.
