

BOARD OF IMMIGRATION:

REPORT FOR 1879.

Laid upon the Table by the Colonial Treasurer, and ordered by the House to be printed, August 10, 1880.



Immigration Office, 9th July, 1880.

Sir,

THE Board of Immigration have the honor to forward their Report for the year ending 31st December, 1879.

The number of Bounty Immigrants introduced during the year exceeded that for 1878 by twelve. The Immigrants consisted of ten married couples and the wives of two Immigrants already in the Colony, four single males and ten single females,—giving a total of thirty-six adults, besides seven male and thirteen female children,—in all fifty-six souls,—the cost to the Board for their introduction being four hundred and sixty-six pounds.

Sixteen males and twenty-seven females came from England, two males and five females from Ireland, one male and one temale from Scotland, and two males and two females from Denmark.

Land Certificates were issued to forty-six individuals under the 7th Section of the Act of Parliament 31 Vict. No. 26, entitling the holders to select two thousand six hundred and fifty acres of the waste lands of the Crown. These Certificates represent fifty-two male and twenty-six female adults, and eighty-three children,—in all one hundred and sixty-one souls.

Sixteen Land Orders were issued under the 5th Section of the same Act, entitling the holders to select or purchase five hundred and thirty-one acres of the waste lands of the Crown, and represented eighteen male and eight female adults, and seven children,—in all thirty-three souls.

During the year the Board issued nine family, eight male and fourteen female Bounty Tickets,—receiving the sum of two hundred and eighty-five pounds.

The Agents of the Board in England have not been able to dispose of many of the Bounty Tickets forwarded to them, mainly for the purpose of securing the introduction of well recommended Servants. Those that have arrived have been of a superior class, and immediately secured good situations. One great want is a Book containing a reliable description of the Colony, its resources, together with detailed information for the guidance of those who contemplate emigrating to the Australian Colonies.

The Paper entitled "Information for intending Emigrants," issued by the Board in 1877, though carefully prepared and reliable, does not enter sufficiently into detail to meet the requirements of the emigrating public; and the Board recommend that inducements should be offered to competent persons to take up special subjects, and by these means secure the preparation of a Work that should supply this great want, so detrimental to the interests of the Colony.

This plan has been adopted in New Zealand with great success. It is felt that this question is one for the consideration of the General Government rather than for the Board of Immigration; and they would desire respectfully to bring it under the notice of the Executive.

The balance at the disposal of the Board on the 31st December amounted to £4550 9s. 11d.

Appended are the usual Returns prepared by the Immigration Agent,—five relating to the operations of the Board under the Bounty System, and two to transactions under the Acts of Parliament 31 Vict. No. 26 and 28 Vict. No. 16.

A statement is also appended showing the acreage taken up by the holders of Land Certificates and Land Orders since the date of the last Report.
