



## REMISSION OF DUTY.

PETITION TO THE GOVERNOR.

Presented by Mr. Chapman, and ordered by the House to be printed, 13 August, 1862.



To His Excellency Colonel Thomas Goree Browne, C.B., Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

The humble Petition of the Very Reverend William Hall, D.D., Roman Catholic Vicar-General of Hobart Town.

## SHOWETH:

That, in May last, your Petitioner received from England a Case containing articles essentially necessary for the Service of the Roman Catholic Church, of the value of £125.

That your Petitioner wrote to the Honorable the Colonial Treasurer, requesting that the said articles might be delivered without payment of the *ad Valorem* Duty, as all Bells and Organs for Churches are exempted from that Duty.

That the Honorable the Colonial Treasurer, in reply, regretted that it was not in the power of the Executive to accede to your Petitioner's request.

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays that Your Excellency will kindly order the amount already paid to be refunded.

And your Petitioner will ever pray, &c.
