

To His Excellency Frederick Aloysius Weld, Esquire, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and for Tasmania and its Dependencies, in Council.

The humble Petition of Frederica Olivia Walker, of Launceston, in Tasmania, Widow.

## RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That your Petitioner, her husband Henry Hirst Walker, and three children, arrived in Tasmania in April, 1870; and that shortly after such arrival a Land Order under the Immigration Act, 1867, was duly issued to her said husband for the selection of 72 acres of land.

That the said Henry Hirst Walker died in October, 1873, intestate and in straitened circumstances; and your Petitioner therefore most respectfully requests that you will be pleased to allow her to operate under the said Land Order in the room and place of her deceased husband.
