

Education—21 could read and write; 2 read only; 5 could neither read nor write. The daily average was 7.24; and the average period of detention, 117.36.

The highest number of inmates at any one time was 10; the lowest number was 4.

Two patients were dealt with by the Police Magistrate for refusing to work and disorderly conduct, and sentenced to one month's imprisonment each; otherwise the conduct of the inmates was good.
