

ANNUAL REPORT of the Tasmanian Council of Education for the Year 1882-3.

To His Excellency Sir George Cumine Strahan, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

1. In conformity with the provisions of "The Tasmanian Council of Education and 22Vict. No. 1, Scholarship Act," we have the honor to submit this our Twenty-third Report of the Section 30. proceedings of the Council from 1st May, 1882, to 30th April, 1883.

- 2. The Hon. Henry Butler was re-elected President for the year ending 30th June, President.
- 3. The Annual Examination of Candidates for the Council of Education Exhibitions was held in the month of June, 1882. Thirteen male and two female Students presented themselves for examination; and, on the recommendation of the Examiners, Exhibitions Gazette of the annual value of £20 each for four years were awarded to the under-mentioned Notice, 11th Candidates:—Frederick Grueber Thorne, Hutchins School; John Wilson, Church July, 1881. Grammar School, Launceston; Walter John Johnstone, Church Grammar School, Launceston: Harry Brisbane Jamieson, Horton College; Ernest Wm. John Ireland, Mr. Ireland, School, College Mr. Ireland's, Scotch College.

The Examiners, in closing their Report, observe:

"In comparing the results of this Examination with those of last year, we observe a considerable increase in the number of marks gained. The two at the head of the list this year have gained more marks than the senior of last year; the third of this year is exactly equal to the second, and the fourth of this year ranks above the third of last year; seven of this year's Candidates come in between the third and fourth of last year; while the twelfth of this year would have ranked sixth last year. This may of course be to a certain extent due to the application of a different standard by fresh Examiners, but we venture to think that it points in some degree to better preparation on the part of the Candidates.

We notice with much satisfaction that the second and third on this year's list are Exhibitioners of the Board of Education.

We regret that neither of the two female Candidates has been successful, more especially as we observe that their age precludes them from having another opportunity of competing. We hope, however, that their failure will not deter others from coming forward on a future occasion. This is the first time that girls have competed, and it will be seen that one of them, bearing the well-known and honored name of Poulett-Harris, though unsuccessful in gaining an Exhibition, has taken a good place on the list."

4. The twenty-third examination for the Degree of Associate of Arts was held in Degree of December, 1882; the Rev. J. E. Bromby, D.D., Melbourne, being Examiner in English, Associate of Arts, Gazette Pure Mathematics, Natural Philosophy, Chemistry, and Geology; Alfred Doran, Esq., Notice, 19th B.A., Examiner in History and Geography, and French; Latin and Greek were under-Dec., 1882.

taken jointly by Dr. Bromby and Mr. Doran; the Rev. Thomas Kelsh, Examiner in Italian; J. A. Jackson, Esq., B.A., Examiner in German; Henry Hunter, Esq., Examiner in Drawing; and J. Summers, Esq., Examiner in Music. Twenty-four Candidates under nineteen years of age presented themselves, and thirteen succeeded in obtaining the Degree,—seven being placed in the First Class, two in the Second Class, and four in the Third Class.

This was the first examination under the regulation abolishing the Preliminary

Examination, and making a pass in English essential to obtaining the Degree.

Of the Candidates who failed there were five who obtained sufficient marks to qualify for a Degree had they passed in English.

Ralph Stuart Stephenson, as Senior Associate of the year, received the Council's Gold Medal; he also gained the Second Prizes for Greek and Mathematics, and a Prize for Geology. Prizes were also awarded to the under-mentioned Associates who were placed in the First Class, as follows:—Lucy Jane Augusta Hudspeth, the Council's Silver Medal, as Senior Female Associate of the year, First Prize for English, for French, and for German, and a Prize for Music; Arthur Augustus Stephens, First Prize for Italian; Kenneth Maxwell, First Prize for Greek; Edward Laret Hall, who was placed in the Second Class, obtained a Special Prize for Mathematics.

The Examiner-in-Chief in his Report observes:-

"The most remarkable feature in this year's examination has been the signal success of the female Candidates. The average of the whole number has not been particularly high, a result partly due to the greater number who presented themselves for examination, and partly also to the alteration in the Preliminary Examination."

Tasmanian Scholarships, Gazette Notice, 19th Dec., 1882. 5. The Examination for Tasmanian Scholarships took place in December last, and was conducted by the Rev. J. E. Bromby, D.D., assisted by A. Doran, Esq., B.A. Five Candidates presented themselves; two—Percy Leslie Waterhouse, A.A., 1879, and Walter Henry Tofft, A.A., 1879—reached the standard prescribed by the Council. A Scholarship was awarded to each of them, and they have since proceeded to England to enter upon their University studies.

One other Candidate, Evett Gordon Allport, A.A., 1880, came within the limits of eligibility for a Scholarship.

Dowdell's Scholarship. 6. The Legislature, in the Session of 1882, under Act 46 Vict. No. 49, conferred upon Mr. Charles Seymour Dowdell a Scholarship of the value of £200 per annum for four years.

Scholars' progress.

7. With regard to the progress of Tasmanian Scholars in England, we have received from the Tutor of Corpus College a statement to the effect that Mr. Clemons "has in every way conducted himself to the satisfaction of the College, and that he has no doubt, when the time comes, but he will distinguish himself in the University examination." We also learn that Mr. J. Warnock, of Edinburgh University, obtained a Second Class Certificate of Merit in the Classes of Chemistry and Anatomy. Mr. Claud Rock entered Clare College in the Michaelmas Term, 1882, and in the following December he passed the Primary Examination "First Class in every subject." Mr. Fredk. Lodge passed his entrance or matriculation for New College, Oxford, in May last, passing well in Mathematics; he subsequently passed satisfactorily an examination in lieu of

Responsions to qualify as an Undergraduate; also College Examination in December and March last: in the latter he obtained 10th place out of 26, there being above him 5 Scholars and 1 Exhibitioner.

8. The two Minor Scholarships at the disposal of the Council for this year have been Minor awarded to Ralph Stuart Stephenson and Thomas George Stanton Crouch, they having intimated their intention to study and compete for a Tasmanian Scholarship. These Scholarships are each of the value of £40 per annum, and are tenable for two years.

9. The Dry Scholarship was awarded to Ralph Stuart Stephenson, Senior Associate Dry Scholarof the year, he having announced his intention of studying for the Tasmanian Scholarship ship. Examination.

10. From information and suggestions offered by those Scholars who have pursued their studies at the Universities under the provisions of the Tasmanian Scholarship Act, Scholarship Rectangle. we have taken the opportunity of so modifying the Scheme for the Tasmanian Scholarship Examination as to admit of Candidates specially devoting their attention to either Classics or Mathematics, or both.

With a view to still further improvement in this direction, our attention is at present engaged on certain suggestions forwarded to us by Tasmanian Scholars who have passed their University course.

11. We have caused the following alteration to be made in Section 24 of our Rules Alteration in Regulations, and have duly obtained the approprial of Your Excellency in Council Rules: and Regulations, and have duly obtained the approval of Your Excellency in Council thereto:-

12. We have much pleasure in being able to state that the Authorities of the London Uni-University of London have been pleased to appoint Hobart as a centre for holding Local Examinations, under our supervision, for the Matriculation Examination, and for the for Matricu-Degrees in the Faculty of Arts and Law, in connection with that University.

Examination lation and Degrees.

13. The Trustees of the "Gilchrist Education Trust" have notified certain changes Gilchrist in the conditions of the Scholarship, which are set forth in the subjoined letter which has been forwarded to us by the Hon. the Chief Secretary:-

Scholarship. Alteration in conditions.

4, Broad Sanctuary, Westminster, S.W., August 8th, 1882.

I HAVE the honor of informing you, by direction of the Trustees of the Gilchrist Educational Trust, that they have decided to make a change in the conditions of the Scholarship at present offered biennially to Tasmanian candidates, by uniting it with a Scholarship of the same value biennially awarded to candidates selected by the University of Sydney, and thus constituting a Scholarship of £100 per annum, to be annually competed for by candidates from any of the Australian Colonies, or from Tasmania, on the same terms as the biennial Scholarship at present offered to Tasmanians.

The examinations will be held in such of the Colonies as may apply for them to the University of London through the Colonial Office; the first in January, 1884.

As these examinations are already held biennially in Tasmania, it will only be requisite for you to write to the Registrar of the University of London requesting that they may be held annually.

- 14. Since the publication of our last Report an examination for Matriculation at the University of Melbourne has been held in Hobart under our supervision.—2nd February Term, 1882—One Candidate only presented himself, but he did not succeed in passing.
- 15. We submit a Statement of the Disbursements of the Council between the 1st January and the 31st December, 1882, the termination of the financial year, together with a Supplementary Statement of Payments between the 1st January and the 30th April, 1883. The total expenditure under every head for the year 1882 is shown to have amounted to £1793 2s. 4d.
