



LAUNCESTON AND DELORAINE RAILWAY.

PETITION FROM MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF LAUNCESTON IN FAVOUR OF.

Presented by Mr. Douglas, and ordered by the House to be printed, 29 August, 1865.



To the Honorable the Members of the House of Assembly of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

The Petition of the Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Launceston, in Council assembled.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That a Bill is now before your Honorable House providing for the construction of a Railway from the Town of Launceston to Deloraine.

That the carrying out of this important work is essential to the prosperity, not only of the Districts immediately concerned, but of the whole Colony.

Your Petitioners therefore pray that your Honorable House will be pleased to pass the said Bill, so that this undertaking, which has been so long and so earnestly desired by the Northern Colonists, may be speedily and successfully carried out.
